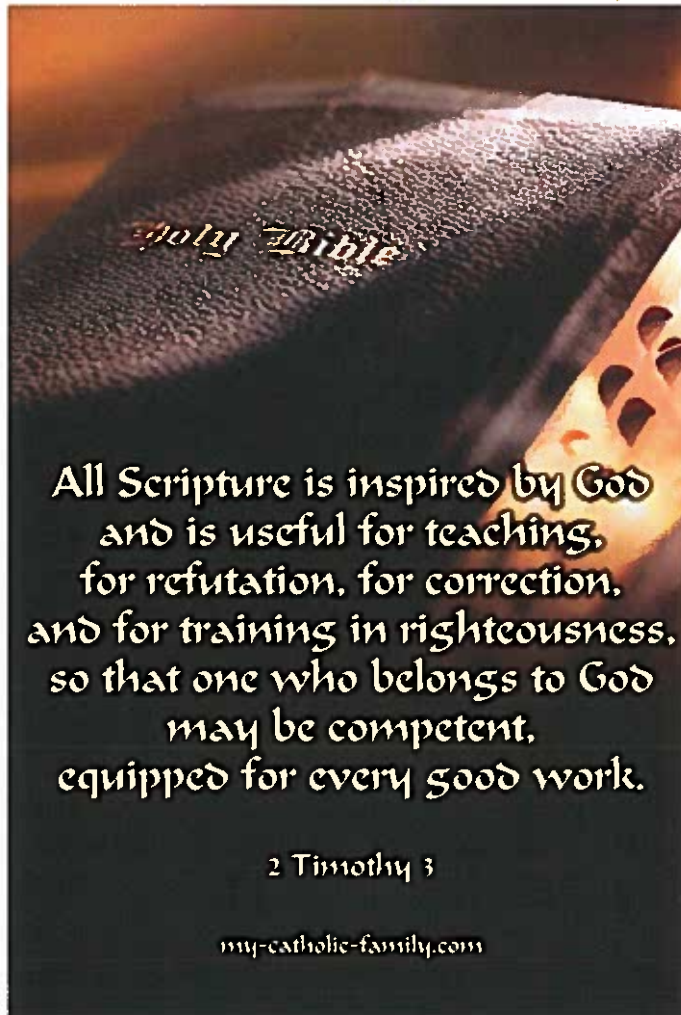

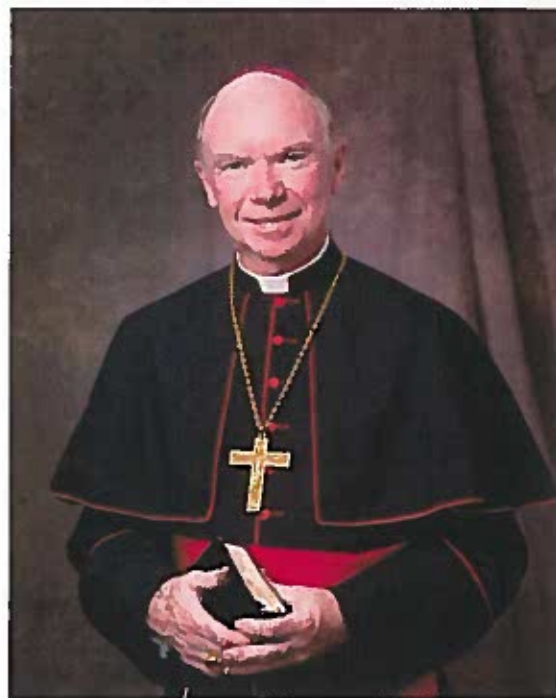

Alpha provides an opportunity to meet others and chat about some of life's big questions in an open and friendly environment. Alpha is for anyone and everyone. Weekly sessions include:

- a meal
- an intriguing talk on DVD.
- followed by small group discussions

People enjoy great food, laughter and learning in a fun and non-threatening atmosphere where no question about life or God is seen as too simple or too hostile...questions like:

- Is there a God?
- How can I really experience Him?
- Why am I here?
- Where am I going?
- Can I really trust that God answers all my prayers?

Connect Groups

We value relationships! One of the key aims of ALPHA is to build relationships, to build community. Once people complete their Alpha experience it is important to continue building relationships, building community. After one finishes their ALPHA experience they will be invited to get involved in a Connect Group. Connect Groups meet every two weeks in homes across our parish and are a great way to build relationships, grow closer to Christ and get connected. Think *Catholic house party*. A Connect Group involves 15 or so people (families are included). It begins with a pot-luck meal, continues with a combination of prayer, Scripture, teaching, witnessing and social time.

Discipleship Groups

We value relationships! Discipleship groups are more for those who want to deepen their faith on a particular subject. The leaders choose a particular DVD series available in the parish office and then invite several (ideally six to eight) to join them for six or so weeks to view the DVD and follow the leaders' guide. This has a set beginning and end. Again the evening begins with a simple pot luck meal, followed by the watching of the DVD and discussion and social time to follow. This ideally takes place once a month in parishioners' homes or possibly in the parish centre. Once you have completed ALPHA the discipleship groups might be for you.
