

Alpha course testimonial - Mark Levac, December 4, 2016



Was my knowledge & understanding of my Catholic Faith adequate? Would I be able to commit the time? What would I gain from participating and host a small group discussion?

Despite my reluctance, I did commit to take the course and be a group host and now am very grateful that I did. As it turned out, Alpha was not a test of my Faith. Rather, it was an opportunity to renew my relationship with Jesus.

So what did Alpha do for me?

First, it was a wonderful social gathering, complete with an incredible meal every week. I can't discount the importance that food played in setting the stage at each session. Seated together with my group members, it gave me an opportunity to get to know them better, most of which I had never met before. I made new friends. Today, I am closer to this Parish community than I was before Alpha. I believe my experience in that respect is shared by many others who attended Alpha with me.

Second, I found the videos each and every week to be thought provoking and inspiring — inspiring in the sense that I came to appreciate that there are many people in this world searching for answers and for direction in their Spiritual Journeys and perhaps more importantly, the role that Jesus plays in their lives.

Alpha inspired me to stop and reflect on my own life. What is my personal relationship with Jesus? Alpha showed me that I can achieve a deeper relationship

with Him, by reading scripture and through prayer. The power of prayer is truly overwhelming.

Third and finally, in my small group discussions I was encouraged to share my life experiences and my opinions, but my privacy was also respected and often I would just sit and listen. There was no pressure to speak or to share. As a result, I gained much from the courage and experiences of others. We were all there to reflect and share our views; not to teach or to preach. We were not being judged.

So, I encourage you to consider getting involved in the next Alpha course in January, as a participant, a group host or a helper. If not you, perhaps someone close to you who you feel might benefit; a child, a brother or sister, a close friend; or someone who has fallen away from the Church and is searching for answers about their Faith or their relationship with Jesus. Or maybe they feel they don't have a relationship with Jesus – Alpha could be the first step.

Alpha is a safe place where I could be myself and it also provided an experience of warm hospitality; a sense of belonging. That is really the foundation we all need to develop a personal relationship with Jesus. We lead busy, often hectic and stressful lives, but I invite you to open your heart and make the commitment to try Alpha. It will be time well spent.
