Her presentation will include an overview of the euthanasia laws and practices in Canada and an exploration of some of the issues facing society as well as the practice of medicine and palliative care in a country where euthanasia is legal. A discussion on how we respond to suffering as a community will follow Dr. Herx's presentation. **All CWL members and all members of our parish are cordially invited to attend** what promises to be a very informative evening on the impact of legalized euthanasia in our society. 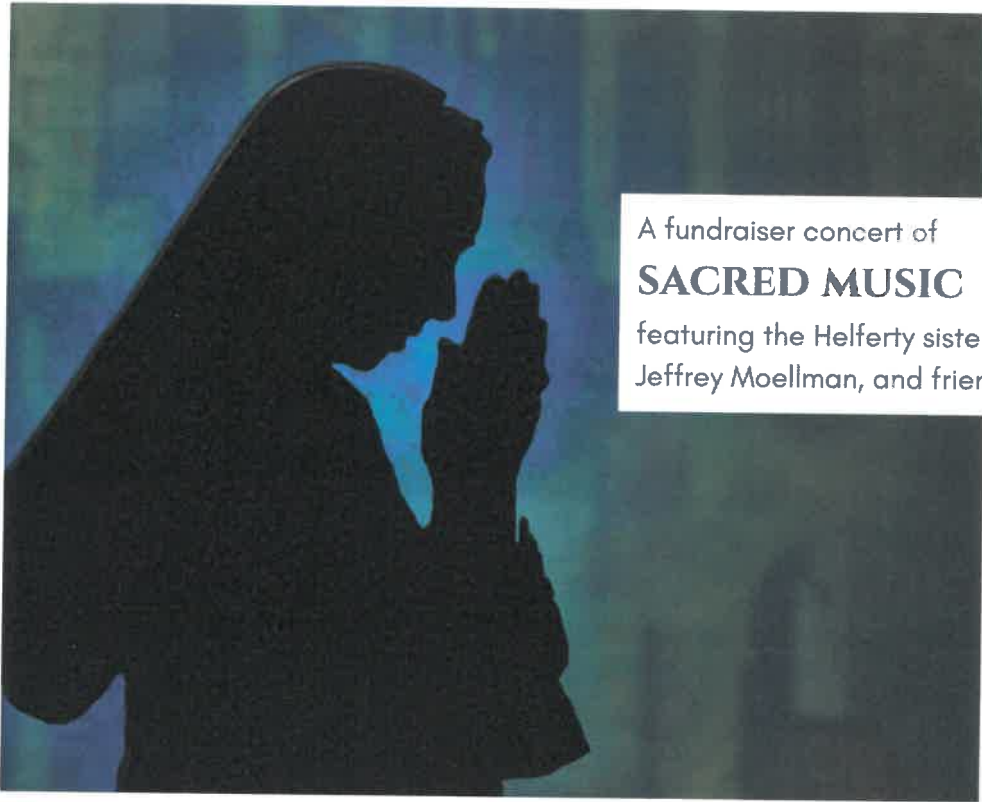

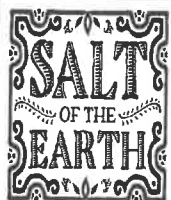
