FROM A TREATISE ON THE LORD'S PRAYER BY SAINT CYPRIAN, BISHOP AND MARTYR (200-258 AD) PART 2

Our prayer is communal

Above all, he who preaches peace and unity did not want us to pray by ourselves in private or for ourselves alone. We do not say "My Father, who art in heaven," nor "Give me this day my daily bread." It is not for himself alone that each person asks to be forgiven, not to be led into temptation or to be delivered from evil. Rather, we pray in public as a community, and not for one individual but for all. For the people of God are all one.

God is then the teacher of harmony, peace and unity, and desires each of us to pray for all men, even as he bore all men in himself alone. The three young men shut up in the furnace (Daniel 3) of fire observed this rule of prayer. United in the bond of the Spirit they uttered together the same prayer. The witness of holy Scripture describes this incident for us, so that we might imitate them in our prayer. Then all three began to sing in unison, blessing God. Even though Christ had not yet taught them to pray, nevertheless, they spoke as with one voice.

It is for this reason that their prayer was persuasive and efficacious. For their simple and spiritual prayer of peace merited the presence of the Lord. So too, after the ascension we find the apostles and the disciples praying together in this way. Scripture relates: *They all joined together in continuous prayer, with the women including Mary, the mother of Jesus, and his brothers.* (Acts 1:14) They all joined together in continuous prayer. The urgency and the unity of their prayer declares that *God, who fashions a bond of unity among those who live in his home,* (Ephesians 4:1-6) will admit into his divine home for all eternity only those who pray in unity.

My dear friends, the Lord's Prayer contains many great mysteries of our faith. In these few words there is great spiritual strength, for this summary of divine teaching contains all of our prayers and petitions. And so, the Lord commands us: *Pray then like this: Our Father, who art in heaven.* (Matthew 6:9) We are new men; we have been reborn and restored to God by his grace. We have already begun to be his sons and we can say "Father." John reminds us of this: *He came to his own home, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who received him, who believe in his name, he gave the power to become children of God.* (John 1: 11-12) Profess your belief that you are sons of God by giving thanks. Call upon God who is your Father in heaven.

**Prayer for the Consecration of Canada
to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary
at the Parish Sunday Masses of July 1 and 2, 2017**

The Priest leads the people in an act of consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. After the introduction the Priest, if possible, he stands before a statue or image of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and says the following:

Father Shawn: My brothers and sisters,
when the first Christian believers came to these shores,
they venerated the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary,
and, as a sign of their faith in her Son and the power of his Resurrection,
they planted a Cross made of the fresh timber of the New World,
placing their lives under Mary's maternal protection.
As we celebrate the 150th Anniversary of Confederation,
let us entrust our country, Canada, and its people to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

All pause for a moment. Then the Priest continues.

O Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God and Mother of the Church,
you have given us the example of a sinless life in Christ Jesus,
and now, by our Baptism, we hope one day to share with you fully
the glorious freedom of the children of God.

You have been our constant companion on our journey through history,
in times of peace, conflict, and reconciliation,
and especially now when we celebrate a greater sense
of our unity and nationhood.

With full confidence we come before you today,
giving thanks to God on the 150th anniversary of the Canadian Confederation,
and, gathered in the communion of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit,
we place ourselves completely in the inner sanctuary of your Immaculate Heart,
and we commit the past, the present and the future of Canada
to your maternal care.

For this reason, O Immaculate Virgin, in union with Brendan, our Archbishop,
I commend to your Immaculate Heart this Parish and all its people.

Immaculate Mother of God,
as we find ourselves at a crossroads at this time in our history,
we give thanks for the advances and new discoveries of science and technology,
yet we know the human heart is tempted by selfish interests
and false ideas about the human person, life and freedom.

As so, Loving Mother of Our Saviour, we seek your help, that we may always be faithful to the values of the Gospel in following Christ Jesus, and through your intercession we pray to your Son that he hear the prayers we make this day for ourselves and our country:

That we live in peace with all people of good will and engage in a dialogue that shows respect and friendship to others. We pray to the Lord.

That we uphold religious freedom in Canada and the natural rights of parents and families. We pray to the Lord.

That we protect the unborn, help the poor, reach out to the marginalized and give support to the infirm and elderly. We pray to the Lord.

That when we are weighed down by our concerns, may the Virgin Mary, our Mother and the new Eve, give us hope for the future. We pray to the Lord.

That the Immaculate Virgin will intercede for all the people of Canada, especially the Indigenous Peoples, the first stewards of this land of Canada, and all immigrants, refugees and visitors. We pray to the Lord.

And now, let us pray together in the words that Gabriel and Elizabeth used to greet the Blessed Virgin Mary.

All pray together:

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee
Blessed are you among women,
And blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.
Holy Mary, Mother of God,
Pray for us sinners,
Now and at the hour of our death. Amen

Archbishop O'Brien celebrated his 30th Anniversary as a Bishop this past Thursday, June 29th, 2017. This makes His Grace the longest serving bishop in Canada. He will also be celebrating his 10th anniversary as Archbishop of Kingston, on July 25th, 2017. We will celebrate both anniversaries as a cathedral and an archdiocese on Sunday, July 30th at the 10:30 am Mass followed by a formal luncheon under the tents on the cathedral lawns. You are invited and encouraged to attend the Sunday Mass and luncheon on July 30th.

Early life and ministry

Brendan Michael O'Brien was born in Ottawa, the oldest of the seven children of Redmond and Margaret (née Foran) O'Brien. He attended the University of Ottawa and St. Paul University, from where he earned his licentiates in philosophy and theology, before being ordained to the priesthood on June 1, 1968 and celebrated his first Mass at his home parish, St George's Catholic Church (Ottawa).

Father O'Brien then did pastoral work in Ottawa and served as Co-Director of the Diocesan Synod. In 1971 he went to Rome, where he studied at the Pontifical Lateran University's *Accademia Alfonsianum*, from which he obtained a doctorate in moral theology. Father O'Brien, upon his return to Canada in 1975, was a professor at his *alma mater*, St. Paul University, and served as pastor of an Ottawa parish.

Episcopate

On May 6, 1987, Father O'Brien was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Ottawa and Titular Bishop of *Numana* by Pope John Paul II. He received his episcopal consecration on the following June 29, 1987 from Archbishop Joseph-Aurèle Plourde, with Bishops John Beahen and Gilles Bélisle serving as co-consecrators. Bishop O'Brien was later named Bishop of the diocese of Pembroke, Ontario on May 5, 1993, and Archbishop of St. John's, Newfoundland on December 4, 2000.

On June 3, 2007 Pope Benedict XVI, named Archbishop O'Brien to succeed the late Archbishop Anthony G. Meagher as the 14th Bishop and 9th Archbishop of Kingston. Archbishop O'Brien's installation as Kingston's ordinary took place on July 25, 2007.
