GREAT NEWS FOR OUR ARCHDIOCESE:

Archbishop Brendan O'Brien is pleased to announce that **Brian Russell**, a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Kingston, will be ordained to the **Transitional Diaconate on Saturday, June 24, 2017.** You are encouraged to participate in this celebration, which will take place at **10:30 a.m. at St. Francis Xavier Parish in Brockville.** The transitional diaconate is the stage immediately prior to ordination to the priesthood. It is the first level of Holy Orders. If all goes as planned



Deacon Brian will be ordained to the Holy Priesthood in May or June of 2018. The second level of Holy Orders is priesthood and the fullness of Holy Orders is the episcopacy (bishops). Thus all priests are previously ordained deacons and all bishops are previously ordained deacons and priests. The permanent diaconate, to which Deacon Blaine Barclay is ordained is a vocation to which men who mostly are married are called. *Diaconos* is a Greek word meaning servant. The Deacons of the early Church were ordained to see to the needs of those on the peripheries of society: the widows, the orphans, the poor, the hungry, the sick, the imprisoned... those in need. In the Liturgy they always proclaim the Gospel when they are present. They are also permitted by their Orders to preach on the word of God and assist the priest at the altar. The deacon also can preside at weddings and funerals that take place outside of Mass.

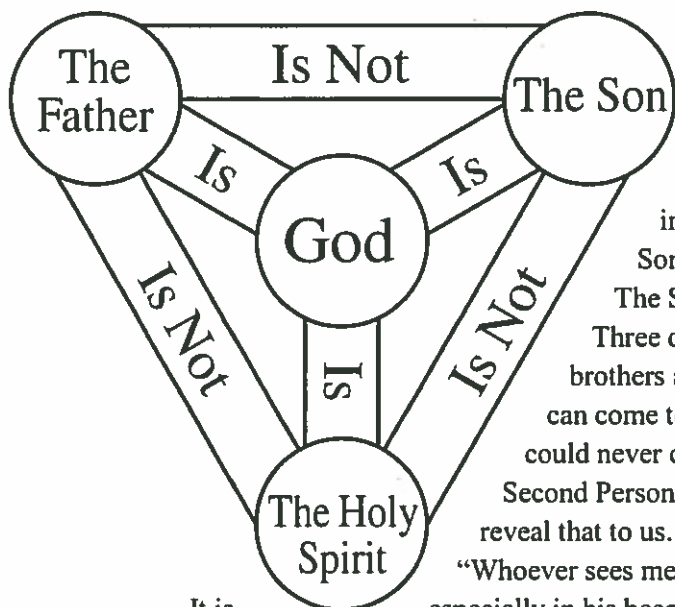
Totus Tuus Catholic Summer Camp! Registration Open!

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Many find the diagram to the right helpful in attempting to understand more deeply the great mystery of the three Persons in One God of the Blessed Trinity. The Father is God. The Son is God. The Holy Spirit is God. But the Father is not the Son. The Son is not the Holy Spirit and the Holy Spirit is not the Father. Three distinct persons yet one God. In the Old Testament our ancient brothers and sisters in the Faith, the Jews, related to God as Father. We can come to the existence of God through our own reason. However, we could never come to the existence of the Trinity on our own. We need the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, the Son, to take on our human nature and reveal that to us. Jesus said: "The I and the Father are one." (John 10:30) "Whoever sees me sees the Father." (John 14:9) "Jesus is the image of the Father.

It is especially in his becoming man, in his work of salvation that Christ is recognized as the image of the Father. His deeds reveal the love of the Father. Thus the very immensity of his self-abasement reveals the immensity of the Father. It is true the flesh is somewhat 'opaque': the Incarnation hides and veils the glory of the Word. The incomparable beauty of Christ's divinity makes his humanity appear as all but an outward ugliness. Yet this outward ugliness is the very revelation of the greatness of the love from which it flows. The self-abandonment even to the ugliness of death makes visible the love of the Father, a love willing to give the Son in sacrifice, Thus the Son reveals the Father in the very lowliness of the Son taking "the form of a slave" (Philippians 2:) The one on the Cross is the visible image of the invisible God." (Cardinal Christoph Schonborn: God's Human Face)

The Trinity ultimately is the life of God, the inner life of God, the life of God that we are called to share in, to participate in; that is what's important for us, this sharing in God's life, in this life we call it Grace, in the next life we call it Heaven. This inner life of God is a relationship of love; theologians will tell us that the Holy Spirit is the love that exists between the Father and the Son, a love so perfect and so great, that He is Himself a person. This is key for us, and for how we relate to our God. If we look to many of the ancient religions, to the pagan religions we often find that the people created a whole pantheon of gods for themselves, because if you think about it, the idea of a single, solitary god is a rather scary thought. A lonely god, who created us for the sake of having some companionship; how could we, limited, weak human beings that we are, how could we ever adequately return the affections of an all-powerful god? But our God is not alone, our God is a community of persons, a relationship of love. God does not need anything from us, God is perfectly content and perfectly complete in Himself, but like any relationship of true love, that love went beyond God, to us, God created us out of love.

So often though, as our first reading makes clear, we reject that love, that life that God offers to us, because we are a "stiff-necked" people as Moses says, a stubborn people. We turn away from God in our sinfulness, we look at all that we have received from God, and we forget who it comes from. But our God, in his love for us continues to give us opportunities to come back, to share in His life. He even sent his Son into the world to offer Himself as a sacrifice to save us from our sins, to break down the barrier between us and God, that we might once again have that opportunity to share in his life. Again though, so often we forget that everything we have comes from God, all of our possessions, our relationships, our gifts and talents, even the good works we do are by the grace of God. We look at our possessions and we want more, we look at our talents, our good works, and we puff up our pride, we forget that they are all gifts from God, freely given out of love. As many theologians would tell us, the only thing that we human being can do or achieve without God, is sin. That is why we come here each and every week, to this Holy Eucharist, because this is the perfect way to offer our thanks to God for his love and his gifts. By sharing in the sacrifice of the Son, we renew our relationship, and our resolve to persevere in the life of grace, so that by constantly living in that life of grace in the here and now, we might share forever in the life of the Holy Trinity, in the kingdom of heaven.

Discipleship Groups are small groups that are focused on learning content such as Bible studies and adult faith formation programs. The Groups, composed of 4 to 8 people, meet for a definite period of time, usually six weeks, to study a specific program. They follow the same format as ALPHA; meeting weekly in a private home to pray, share a meal together, watch a video series and discuss the content. However, unlike Connect Groups, which are intended to meet monthly on a continual basis, Discipleship Groups dissolve once their specific study program is completed. FROM ARCHBISHOP O'BRIEN:



In response to the humanitarian crisis in South Sudan, Yemen, Somalia, and northeast Nigeria, an ecumenical appeal has been launched to provide assistance to the 20 million victims of the devastating famine. The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops is asking all dioceses to encourage support for the *Pray, Give, Speak Out* project, which is asking people to:

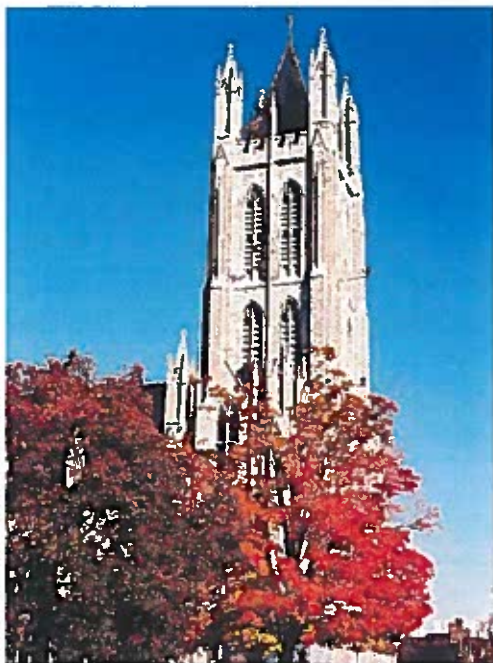

WHY AN AUTOMATIC DEBIT PLAN?

It allows St. Mary's parishioners to make their regular Sunday offering using "Direct Debit" system. Automatic Debit is an option, not a requirement! It is being used throughout the Archdiocese of Kingston. We would like to make it available to those St. Mary's parishioners who would like to take advantage of it.

When you participate in the automatic debit system, your regular Sunday offerings are only withdrawn from your account **once** a month, on or about the 30th day of each month and deposited into the parish account. It does not include any special collections including cathedral restorations/preservations. You will be able to contribute to all special collections, cathedral restorations/preservations using your envelopes.

WILL I STILL USE ENVELOPES?

Envelopes will continue to be issued to all parishioners who request them. Those who choose to use the automatic debit system can simply write PAD (pre-authorized debit) on their regular offertory envelope and drop them into the collection basket. You can also use your envelopes for the special collections not covered by your automatic debit offering

BENEFITS FOR YOU & FOR ST. MARY'S

Automatic Debit is convenient. Your offering is deducted automatically. You will no longer need to search for your cheque book, buy cheques to use for your Church offerings, or stop and withdraw cash from the bank on the way to Mass.

Automatic debit allows you to support St. Mary's when you are away — a benefit for the church since expenses continue all year long. Most importantly, it's safe and secure. You are protected by very strict banking rules that guarantee your money and account is safe. It's flexible; you can increase, decrease or withdraw from the program at any time simply by dropping a signed note into the collection basket or Parish office 30 days prior to the next withdrawal.

HOW DO I ENROLL IN AUTOMATIC DEBIT?

- A) Decide the amount of your monthly offertory contribution to be withdrawn from your bank account every month. We have included a reference chart to help you convert weekly to monthly.
- B) Fill out the **Automatic Debit Authorization** from this brochure, include a blank cheque marked "VOID" and place both in a sealed envelope.
- C) Place the envelope in the collection basket or drop it by the Parish office or mail it in. It is confidential
