FROM ARCHBISHOP O'BRIEN:

In response to the humanitarian crisis in South Sudan, Yemen, Somalia, and northeast Nigeria, an ecumenical appeal has been launched to provide assistance to the 20 million victims of the devastating famine. Archbishop O'Brien celebrates his 30th Anniversary as a Bishop this Thursday, June 29th, 2017. This makes His Grace the longest serving bishop in Canada. He will also be celebrating his 10th anniversary as Archbishop of Kingston, on July 25th, 2017. We will celebrate both anniversaries as a cathedral and an archdiocese on Sunday, July 30th at the 10:30 am Mass followed by a formal luncheon under the tents on the cathedral lawns. You are invited and encouraged to attend the Sunday Mass and luncheon on July 30th. His Grace will be here this Thursday, the actual day of his anniversary, to celebrate the 12:10 pm Mass.

Early life and ministry

Brendan Michael O'Brien was born in Ottawa, the oldest of the seven children of Redmond and Margaret (née Foran) O'Brien. He attended the University of Ottawa and St. Paul University, from where he earned his licentiates in philosophy and theology, before being ordained to the priesthood on June 1, 1968 and celebrated his first Mass at his home parish, St George's Catholic Church (Ottawa).

Father O'Brien then did pastoral work in Ottawa and served as Co-Director of the Diocesan Synod. In 1971 he went to Rome, where he studied at the Pontifical Lateran University's *Accademia Alfonsianum*, from which he obtained a doctorate in moral theology. Father O'Brien, upon his return to Canada in 1975, was a professor at his *alma mater*, St. Paul University, and served as pastor of an Ottawa parish.

Episcopate

On May 6, 1987, Father O'Brien was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Ottawa and Titular Bishop of *Numana* by Pope John Paul II. He received his episcopal consecration on the following June 29, 1987 from Archbishop Joseph-Aurèle Plourde, with Bishops John Beahen and Gilles Bélisle serving as co-consecrators. Bishop O'Brien was later named Bishop of the diocese of Pembroke, Ontario on May 5, 1993, and Archbishop of St. John's, Newfoundland on December 4, 2000.

On June 3, 2007 Pope Benedict XVI, named Archbishop O'Brien to succeed the late Archbishop Anthony G. Meagher as the 14th Bishop and 9th Archbishop of Kingston. Archbishop O'Brien's installation as Kingston's ordinary took place on July 25, 2007.



From a treatise on the Lord's Prayer by
Saint Cyprian, bishop and martyr (200 AD -
258 AD) PART 1:

Let your prayer come from a humble heart.

When we pray, our words should be calm, modest and disciplined. Let us reflect that we are standing before God. We should please him both by our bodily posture and the manner of our speech. It is characteristic of the vulgar to shout and make a noise, not those who are modest. On the contrary, they should employ a quiet tone in their prayer.

Moreover, in the course of his teaching, the Lord instructed us to pray in secret. Hidden and secluded places, even our own rooms give witness to our belief that God is present everywhere; that he sees and hears all; that in the fullness of his majesty, he penetrates hidden and secret places. This is the teaching of Jeremiah: *Am I God when I am near, and not God when I am far away? Can anyone*

hide in a dark corner without my seeing him? Do I not fill heaven and earth? (Jeremiah 23:24) Another passage of Scripture says: *The eyes of the Lord are everywhere, observing both good and wicked men.* (Proverbs 15:3)

The same modesty and discipline should characterize our liturgical prayer as well. When we gather to celebrate the divine mysteries with God's priest, we should not express our prayer in unruly words; the petition that should be made to God with moderation is not to be shouted at. The Lord showed us this when he asked: *Why do you think evil in your hearts?* (Matthew 9:4) The book of Revelation testifies to this also: *And all the churches shall know that I am the one who searches the heart and the desires.* (Romans 8:27)

Anna maintained this rule; in her observance of it she is an image of the Church. In the First Book of Kings we are told that she prayed quietly and modestly to God in the recesses of her heart. Her prayer was secret but her faith was evident. She did not pray with her voice, but with her heart, for she knew that in this way the Lord would hear her. She prayed with faith and obtained what she sought. Scripture makes this clear in the words: *She was speaking in her heart; her lips were moving but her voice could not be heard; and the Lord heard her prayer.* (1 Samuel 1:13) The psalmist also reminds us: *Commune within your own hearts, and in the privacy of your room express your remorse.* (Psalm 4:4) This is the teaching of the Holy Spirit. Through Jeremiah he suggests this: *Say in your hearts: Lord, it is you that we have to worship.*

My friends, anyone who worships should remember the way in which the tax-collector prayed in the temple alongside the Pharisee. He did not raise his eyes immodestly to heaven or lift up his hands arrogantly. Instead he struck his breast and confessing the sins hidden within his heart he implored the assistance of God's mercy. While the Pharisee was pleased with himself, the tax-collector deserved to be cleansed much more because of the manner in which he prayed. For he did not place his hope of salvation in the certainty of his own innocence; indeed, no one is innocent. Rather he prayed humbly, confessing his sins. And the Lord who forgives the lowly heard his prayer.

His Grace, Archbishop O'Brien writes:

On the occasion of the 150th Anniversary of Confederation, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has invited each bishop to consecrate his diocese to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, which I will do at St. Mary's Cathedral on Sunday, July 2nd. On either Saturday, July 1st or Sunday, July 2nd, a similar consecration is encouraged in each of our parishes.

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has given us the following explanation of the meaning of consecrating Canada to the Blessed

Virgin Mary:

"Having been baptized and answering the call of our faith, before the Father of all mercies in the name of Christ and in the Holy Spirit, we place ourselves, our loved ones, and our country under the protective mantle of Our Lady, the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of Jesus our Saviour, the Mother of God, the Mother of the Church, and our spiritual Mother. As a pledge in faith, we entrust ourselves to the very woman who, through her free and pure consent at the Annunciation, singularly collaborated in the plan that God should become Incarnate and present in our world as one like us in all things but sin. The consecration of Canada to Our Lady will enrich our faith, allow a more abundant outpouring of God's spiritual and temporal gifts on us, and enable us even more to fulfill our calling and mission. Ultimately, consecration to Mary, which springs from a more fervent, more committed, and more sustained life of prayer and devotion in which the Blessed Mother plays a unique and loving role, points and leads to a renewed spirit and understanding of family, Church, and the need for societal engagement."
