


ST MARY'S REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP: OUR SECOND FAMILY IS ARRIVING SOON!

It has been a long wait, but once again St Mary's refugee committee is preparing to welcome a new family to Canada. Nineteen months ago, we began the sponsorship process for our second refugee family from Burundi. The mother, Seconde, had newly arrived in Canada after having escaped persecution in Burundi for her human rights work. However, since then, Seconde's young adult sons and husband have been living in a refugee camp in Rwanda, one of the sons having escaped Burundi by swimming the river that divides Burundi and Rwanda in the middle of the night. Her teenage daughters have been in hiding in Burundi in the home of a family friend.

Finally, this divided family will begin to reunite. We are expecting the arrival of Seconde's husband, Guy, and their sons, Arnaud, Faby, Amy-Doux, and Rodrigue, in the coming months. The required government paperwork has not yet been finalized for their daughters and nephew.

Seconde has already found a house and has asked for our help with moving in. Due to your previous enormous generosity, we already have a large collection of household goods and furniture in storage in our parish centre. We invite everyone interested in helping to please join us on move-in day! We will need many hands – furniture haulers, kitchen organizers, unpackers, and fixer-uppers.




Duc In Altum 2017-18 Info Night



Are You or Someone You Know thinking of becoming a Catholic or interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith?

Consider joining The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). RCIA is an Initiation Process into the Catholic Faith for Adults who a) have never been baptized, b) are Christians baptized in another Faith Tradition seeking now to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church, and c) for Catholics who are baptised, but who have not received either their first Holy Communion and/or the Sacrament of Confirmation and who now wish to complete their Christian initiation.

RCIA is a process of formation and education into the life, worship and mission of disciples of Jesus Christ in the Catholic Church. We gather each Tuesday evening, beginning Tuesday, September 12th, from 7 to 9 pm and continuing and including the great celebration of the Great Easter Vigil and the initiation and reception of candidates into the Catholic Faith, and concludes a few weeks later after a period of postbaptismal catechesis. Father Shawn and Deacon Blaine will head up the Formation Team this year. All those planning on taking the course must meet initially with either Father Shawn, fathershawnihughes@gmail.com or Deacon Blaine at bbarclay31@me.com. Please contact one of us for an appointment.

"In the sacred Host, He is present, the true treasure, always waiting for us. Only by adoring this Presence do we learn how to receive Him properly."


What people are saying about their time spent before the Blessed Sacrament.
