Vespers is the sunset evening prayer service in the Catholic and Orthodox liturgies of the canonical hours. The word comes from the Greek *εσπέρα* and the Latin *vesper*, meaning "evening." It is also referred to in the Anglican tradition as Evening Prayer or Evensong. The prayer consists of an opening hymn, three psalms giving thanks for the day chanted, a brief reading from Scripture, the Magnificat, formal prayer intentions, the Our Father and a closing prayer. The Cathedral was consecrated on the 4th of October, 1848, 169 years ago. The day of the consecration of any church building is a solemnity in that particular parish. A solemnity is a festive liturgical celebration of the highest rank usually reserved to major events in the Life of Our Lord, Our Lady and the Apostles. To celebrate the anniversary of the consecration of the cathedral the choir, under the direction of Jeff Moellman, will lead us in the celebration of this solemn celebration of Vespers. We have not had formal vespers in the cathedral for many, many years. This will be a beautiful prayer and will be something we hope to have much more frequently in the future.

BE AWARE UNDERSTAND ACT

The first two sessions have discussed the 14 rules of St. Ignatius of Loyola discerning what is the difference between spiritual consolation and spiritual desolation and how God acts in each and how the enemy acts in each. The 14 rules also discuss what we are to do when we find ourselves in spiritual desolation.

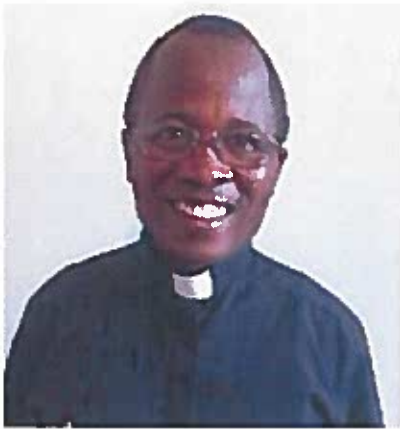

Request for Financial Assistance From Father Francesco in Order to Purchase a Vehicle for Pastoral Ministry upon his return to Tanzania

Father Francesco has been given permission by Archbishop O'Brien to request assistance for his pastoral work when he returns to Tanzania. He has been to St. Patrick's in Napanee, St. Francis de Sales in Smiths Falls, Holy Name of Jesus in Kingston Mills, and is at St. Paul the Apostle, here in Kingston, this weekend.

Introduction

Fr. Francesco is from the Diocese of Iringa, Tanzania. As you know he is returning to Iringa on October 17, to resume his pastoral ministry. While doing his ministry in the parish, he will also be going to the inter-regional tribunal for judicial ministry which is about 100 kilometers away from his diocese. All these activities will require him to have a sure means of transport. The best type and most widely used vehicle for his diocese is the Toyota Land Cruiser Hard top. They have very poor roads and dependable transportation is essential for the parish work which will include up to 8 missions. The people have no vehicles and rely on the priest's vehicle to get them to hospital in times of emergency. Fr. Francesco's own dear mother could possibly have survived her early death if the priest could have got to their village sooner with a reliable vehicle.

Statement of the Problem

The Diocese of Iringa covers an area of more than 43,318 square kilometers. The Diocese has a population of more than 2,524,245 inhabitants of whom 650,461 are Catholics (as of 2013). There are 37 parishes served by 75 indigenous priests, 30 missionary priests and 4 fidei donum priests.

Nine months after his ordination, he was assigned as a pastor of Wasa Parish (it comprises of 14 villages) for seven years. He usually had Mass at the parish center and then went to two more villages for Mass. His first year of ministry in this parish was very difficult because he had an old car which required repair. Sometimes he could not get home because it had broken. After a year however, he received a new car, a Toyota Land Cruiser Hard Top, which was so useful for his pastoral ministry. With it, he could go to the villages for pastoral ministry without any problem. Even though the roads are very bad, with the Toyota Land Cruiser, he was able to go everywhere without any problem. During that time, and even today, most of the Tanzanian people do not have cars. Hence, most of them depend on the priest's car to go to the hospital if they are seriously sick

(especially pregnant women). Always the priest must be ready to rush them to the regional hospital in Iringa. The car also was used to take the faithful (the leaders like CWL, the youth, etc.) to the diocesan centre for meetings. Knowing that he will go back to his diocese for the service of the people, Fr. Francesco is raising the money for a Land Cruiser Hard Top which will greatly help him with his pastoral ministry.

Objectives of the Project

- To ensure adequate religious services to all parishioners throughout the year.
- To provide judicial service at our inter-regional tribunal.
- To take sick people to the hospital whenever it will be needed.
- To take the parishioners to the diocesan Centre for meetings or other functions.

Outcomes of the Project

- Many parishioners will be visited and served in a timely manner.
- It will be easier for Fr. Francesco to offer his service outside his parish (like going to the inter-diocesan tribunal which is almost 100 kilometers away from the diocesan centre).
- Sick persons will be served any time they need a help.
- Taking parishioners to the diocesan centre for meetings whenever it will be required.

Total Amount of the Project

Buying a Toyota Land Cruiser from Japan requires a large amount of money. The entire amount would be virtually impossible for Fr. Francesco to raise without our assistance. However, he has made an application to BEGECA, an association which helps missionaries in mission countries to get a car for pastoral ministry at a great discount. The total amount for the Land Cruiser is estimated to be Euro 26,833, which is a very good price for this type of vehicle.



Amount Requested: Fr. Francesco's Diocese has already raised 19,000 Euros for this project which will be sent to BEGECA, in Germany. This amount falls short of the total cost 7,833 Euros. He has already raised 5,000 Euros. Therefore, he humbly requests a donation from you, the people of St. Mary's, for purchasing this vehicle which will be for the good of the people of God in his home diocese of Iringa, Tanzania.

If you would like to donate to Fr. Francesco's project, please place your cheque payable to Father Francesco Msofu or cash in an envelope with Fr. Francesco's name on it and place it in the collection basket next Sunday or the following Sunday or drop it off at the parish office. The envelopes will be given to Father. Unfortunately, because the money is for outside of Canada a tax receipt cannot be issued for it.
