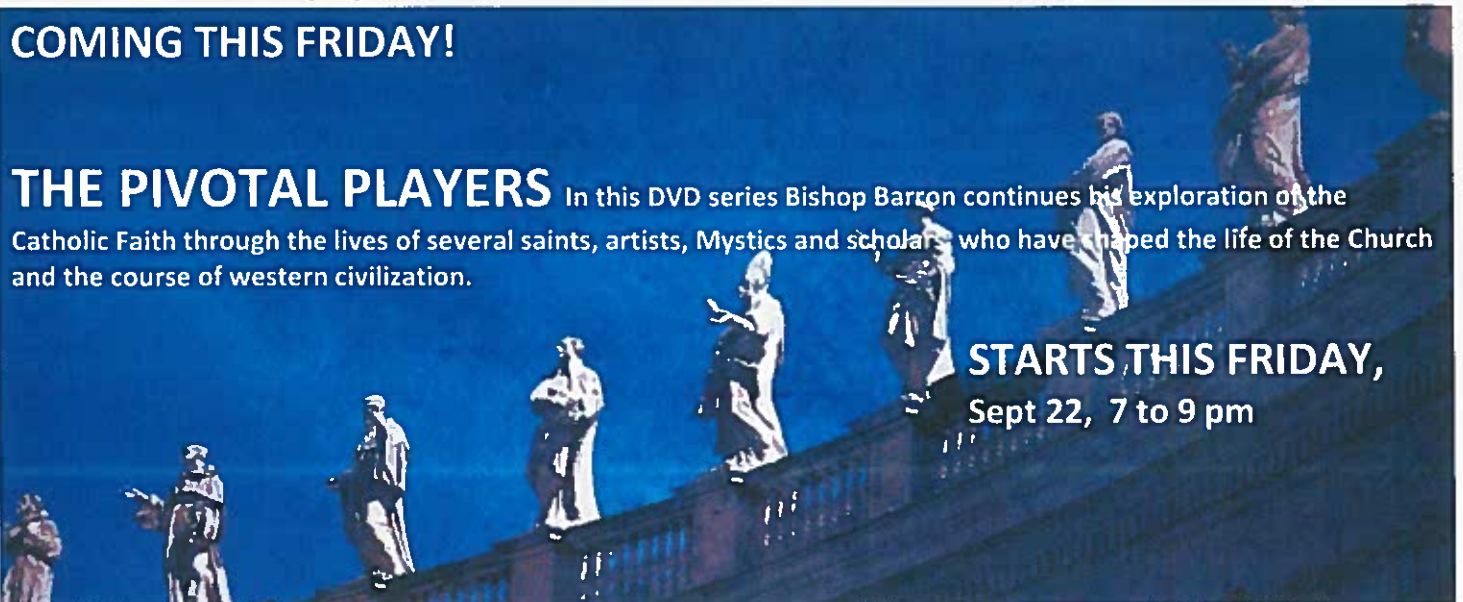

**Vespers (Evening Prayer) Wednesday, October 4, 2017,
7 pm here at St. Mary's Cathedral**

Vespers is the sunset evening prayer service in the Catholic and Orthodox liturgies of the canonical hours. The word comes from the Greek *εσπέρα* and the Latin *vesper*, meaning "evening." It is also referred to in the Anglican tradition as Evening Prayer or Evensong. The prayer consists of an opening hymn, three psalms giving thanks for the day chanted, a brief reading from Scripture, the Magnificat, formal prayer intentions, the Our Father and a closing prayer. The Cathedral was consecrated on the 4th of October, 1848, 169 years ago. The day of the consecration of any church building is a solemnity in that particular parish. A solemnity is a festive liturgical celebration of the highest rank usually reserved to major events in the Life of Our Lord, Our Lady and the Apostles. To celebrate the anniversary of the consecration of the cathedral the choir, under the direction of Jeff Moellman, will lead us in the celebration of this solemn celebration of Vespers. We have not had formal vespers in the cathedral for many, many years. This will be a beautiful prayer and will be something we hope to have much more frequently in the future.

What is Taizé you ask? Taizé is a monastic community located in Taizé, France, founded in the 1940s by a Swiss named Schütz-Marsauche, familiarly called Brother Roger. The "brothers" of Taizé have taken a vow of celibacy and are committed to a lifetime of simplicity, service, and community. There is an ecumenical emphasis at Taizé, as expressed in their official website, which says the community "wants its life to be a sign of reconciliation between divided Christians and between separated peoples." Brother Roger was especially eager to bring Catholics and Protestants together.

A Taizé worship service involves sung and chanted prayers, meditation, a period of silence, liturgical readings, and icons. There is no preaching. The style of prayer practiced at Taizé has attracted many worshipers from around the globe and from many different denominations. The prayers consist of "short chants, repeated again and again," according to an introduction in a Taizé songbook. "The words are sung over many times."

We celebrated the feast of St. John Chrysostom, (347 AD-407 AD) this past Wednesday. He was the Bishop of Constantinople and is a Doctor of the Church meaning everything he has written is worthy of our study. This homily appears in the Liturgy of the Hours on his feast day. He received great opposition in his orthodox teaching being exiled and tortured because of his adherence to the truth of the Faith. This is what he writes after this experiences.

From a homily by Saint John Chrysostom, bishop
Life to me means Christ, and death is gain

The waters have risen and severe storms are upon us, but we do not fear drowning, for we stand firmly upon a rock. Let the sea rage, it cannot break the rock. Let the waves rise, they cannot sink the boat of Jesus. What are we to fear? Death? *Life to me means Christ, and death is gain.* Exile? *The earth and its fullness belong to the Lord.* The confiscation of goods? *We brought nothing into this world, and we shall surely take nothing from it.* I have only contempt for the world's threats, I find its blessings laughable. I have no fear of poverty, no desire for wealth. I am not afraid of death nor do I long to live, except for your good. I concentrate therefore on the present situation, and I urge you, my friends, to have confidence.

Do you not hear the Lord saying: *Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst?* Will he be absent, then, when so many people united in love are gathered together? I have his promise; I am surely not going to rely on my own strength! I have what he has written; that is my staff, my security, my peaceful harbor. Let the world be in upheaval. I hold to his promise and read his message; that is my protecting wall and garrison. What message? *Know that I am with you always, until the end of the world!*

If Christ is with me, whom shall I fear? Though the waves and the sea and the anger of princes are roused against me, they are less to me than a spider's web. Indeed, unless you, my brothers, had detained me, I would have left this very day. For I always say *Lord, your will be done*; not what this fellow or that would have me do, but what you want me to do. That is my strong tower, my immovable rock, my staff that never gives way. If God wants something, let it be done! If he wants me to stay here, I am grateful. But wherever he wants me to be, I am no less grateful.

Yet where I am, there you are too, and where you are, I am. For we are a single body, and the body cannot be separated from the head nor the head from the body. Distance separates us, but love unites us, and death itself cannot divide us. For though my body die, my soul will live and be mindful of my people.

You are my fellow citizens, my limbs, my body. You are my light, sweeter to me than the visible light. For what can the rays of the sun bestow on me that is comparable to your love? The sun's light is useful in my earthly life, but your love is fashioning a crown for me in the life to come.

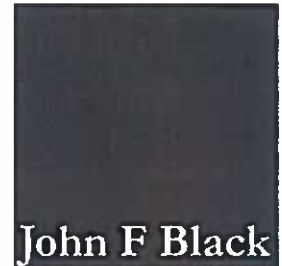
