**Vespers (Evening Prayer) Wednesday, October 4, 2017,  
7 pm here at St. Mary's Cathedral**

Vespers is the sunset evening prayer service in the Catholic and Orthodox liturgies of the canonical hours. The word comes from the Greek *εσπέρα* and the Latin *vesper*, meaning "evening." It is also referred to in the Anglican tradition as Evening Prayer or Evensong. The prayer consists of an opening hymn, three psalms giving thanks for the day chanted, a brief reading from Scripture, the Magnificat, formal prayer intentions, the Our Father and a closing prayer. The Cathedral was consecrated on the 4<sup>th</sup> of October, 1848, 169 years ago. The day of the consecration of any church building is a solemnity in that particular parish. A solemnity is a festive liturgical celebration of the highest rank usually reserved to major events in the Life of Our Lord, Our Lady and the Apostles. To celebrate the anniversary of the consecration of the cathedral the choir, under the direction of Jeff Moellman, will lead us in the celebration of this solemn celebration of Vespers. We have not had formal vespers in the cathedral for many, many years. This will be a beautiful prayer and will be something we hope to have much more frequently in the future.

# EXPERIENCE TAIZÉ

## A SERVICE OF PRAYER, SONG AND CONTEMPLATION

**What is Taizé you ask?** Taizé is a monastic community located in Taizé, France, founded in the 1940s by a Swiss named Schütz-Marsauche, familiarly called Brother Roger. The "brothers" of Taizé have taken a vow of celibacy and are committed to a lifetime of simplicity, service, and community. There is an ecumenical emphasis at Taizé, as expressed in their official website, which says the community "wants its life to be a sign of reconciliation between divided Christians and between separated peoples." Brother Roger was especially eager to bring Catholics and Protestants together.

A Taizé worship service involves sung and chanted prayers, meditation, a period of silence, liturgical readings, and icons. There is no preaching. The style of prayer practiced at Taizé has attracted many worshipers from around the globe and from many different denominations. The prayers consist of "short chants, repeated again and again," according to an introduction in a Taizé songbook. "The words are sung over many times."

Come and experience this very prayerful hour of song, meditation and peace. Tell your friends. Bring a friend. Non Catholics would be very comfortable with this very beautiful evening of candlelight & prayer.

**As Father Francesco will be leaving us in a few weeks (Oct. 17<sup>th</sup>) I asked him to write to you about his vocation to the priesthood.**

### **My Call to Priesthood**

My journey to the priesthood indirectly started when I was seven years old. At that time, I had not yet been baptized. Catholicism was first introduced to my diocese, Iringa, in Tanzania in 1897 by Benedictine Fathers from Germany. Years later, the missionaries arrived in my small home village, called Ukami. In 1986, at the age of sixteen, I was one of twelve catechumens baptized into the Catholic Church. Within this group, I became a priest and another became a nun with the Congregation of the Little Sisters of the Mother of Sorrows (*Suore Minime dell'Addolorata*), founded by St. Clelia Barbier, The Sisters now serve in Bologna, Italy.



**FATHER WITH PARISHIONERS**

When I was seven years old, my mother was pregnant and she needed a caesarian section for the delivery of the baby. Someone assisting my mother was sent to go to the nearest church in another town, called Usokami, to find the pastor so that he could come and take my mother to the hospital. My village was in a very remote place; there were no cars, motorcycles nor bicycles. Without any other means of transportation, the person spent the entire day travelling on foot to Usokami. Unfortunately, the pastor was not in the office that day. The pastor arrived in my village the following day, but my mother had passed away the day before. When he arrived, we were already at the cemetery for the burial. I remember asking, "Who is that white man?" The others told me, "That is a priest who wanted to take your mother to the hospital." At the time, I did not think much about it, but God had gently planted a seed in my heart.



**A VERY BOYISH LOOKING PASTOR CELEBRATING HOLY MASS IN HIS PARISH**

After primary school, I joined a trade school for carpentry, which was part of the Catholic mission in Usokami. At this time, I was still not baptized. One day after Mass, I saw a young man with a long tunic with a sash and asked him why he was dressed like the pastor. He told me that he was a seminarian who was discerning to become a priest. Immediately, I thought back to the priest who wanted to save my mother's life. I asked the seminarian, "Is it even possible for you to become a priest?" to which he responded with a simple, resounding, "Yes." In my ignorance, I thought that only the Italians could be priests. This was because the pastor and his associate pastor were both from Italy. I had never seen an indigenous priest from Tanzania before. To become a priest was beyond my imagination. The seed that God planted in my heart started to take root and sprout. From this moment onwards, I continued to have a strong desire to become a priest, although I still had not been baptized. I could only think about the countless lives a priest would be able to save, especially the lives of sick and dying women.

A few days after my encounter with the seminarian, I sent a letter to the pastor stating that I wanted to become a priest. The pastor was very pleased to hear about my desire, but explained to me that I must first be baptized and confirmed before becoming a seminarian. I was able to immediately join a group of catechumens to prepare for my initiation into the Catholic Church. In 1986, for the first time in history, my small home village of Ukami welcomed twelve newly baptized Catholics. My birth name is Nedro, and at the time of my baptism, I was given the Christian name, Francesco, by my godfather, Brother Giovanni Paolo who was an Italian.

After my baptism and confirmation, I joined a minor seminary and later, a major seminary for my priestly formation. As I continued with my formation, I clearly understood that the priesthood is not only for serving women who are sick. Priests are shepherds called to tend to *every* soul and to bring them closer to God. The Lord calls people in different ways and each priest has a different story about his journey to the priesthood. God does not send a letter to us, clearly outlining what He wants. Instead, He blesses our lives with different circumstances in order for us to discern His will for our sanctification and the sanctification of others. The small seed that the Lord planted in my heart years ago, following an unfortunate circumstance, continues to blossom in the priestly ministry which I am tremendously blessed to be a part of today.



This is Father Francesco in Vigevano, Italy. In his own story above Father was too humble to mention the great education he has. After seminary in Iringa, Tanzania and serving in his diocese as a parish priest Father Francesco was sent by his bishop to study Canon Law in both Switzerland and Italy where he earned a JCL degree, which is a licentiate in Canon Law. Father then came to Canada to pursue doctoral studies in Canon Law at St. Paul University in Ottawa and came to live in Kingston after finishing his course work at St. Paul's university.

He has been a wonderful addition to our priestly community in the rectory and here in the parish. We will miss him greatly when he goes!
