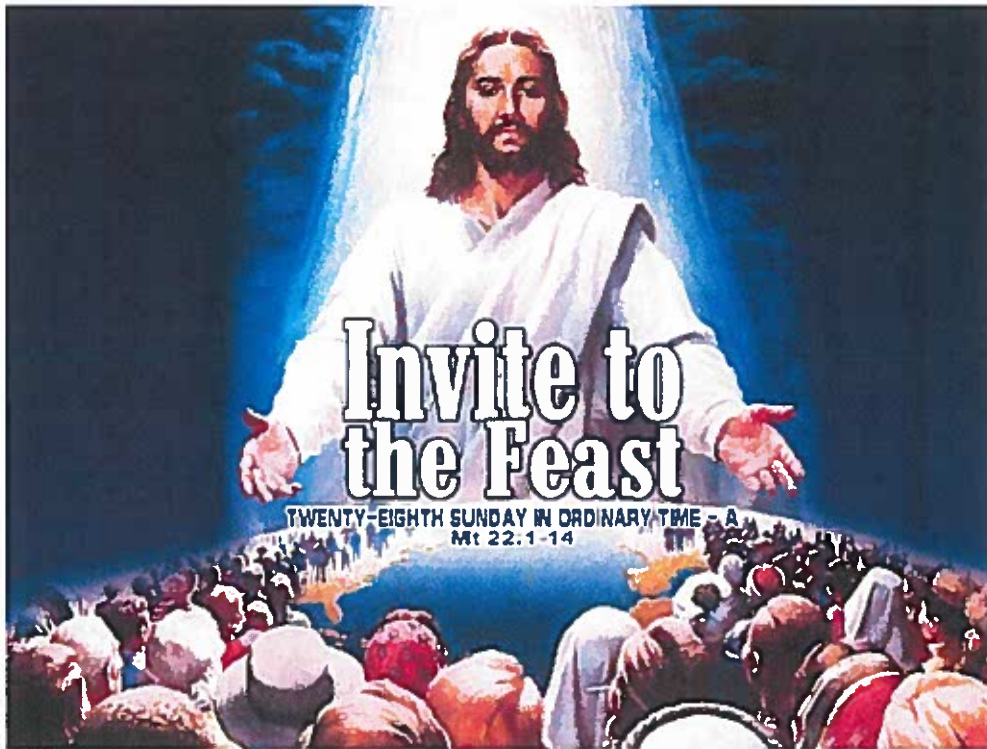

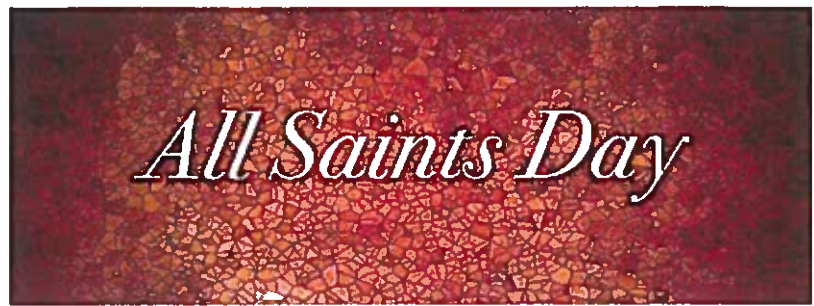

Formal Sung Vespers (Evening Prayer), Wednesday, Nov. 1, 2017, 7 pm here at St. Mary's Cathedral

Vespers is the sunset evening prayer service in the Catholic and Orthodox liturgies of the canonical hours. The word comes from the Greek ἑσπέρα and the Latin vesper, meaning "evening." It is also referred to in the Anglican tradition as Evening Prayer or Evensong. The prayer consists of an opening hymn, three psalms giving thanks for the day chanted, a brief reading from Scripture, the Magnificat, formal prayer intentions, the Our Father and a closing prayer.

PART III: A Continuation from The Discernment of Spirits: An Ignatian Guide for Everyday Living Workshops this past Spring

BE AWARE UNDERSTAND ACT

The first two sessions have discussed the 14 rules of St. Ignatius of Loyola discerning what is the difference between spiritual consolation and spiritual desolation and how God acts in each and how the enemy acts in each. The 14 rules also discuss what we are to do when we find ourselves in spiritual desolation.

These two sessions cover the relatively unknown further 8 rules of St. Ignatius of Loyola in discerning between two spiritual consolations. When an undertaking awakens spiritual joy within us, is this joy, this happy sense of closeness to God, always a sign that God is calling us to the undertaking? If it is not, how may we distinguish when such joy is a sign of God's call and when it is not? And if, in a particular situation, such joy is not an indication of God's promptings, how are we to understand it?

These two sessions will seek to grasp clearly what persons who strive to "rise from good to better" in the service of the Lord they love, and who along the way, face sensitive and critically important discernment regarding spiritual consolation. What do you do when there are two paths proposed to you that are both good. How do you discern which is the one for you to take.

If you did not happen to join us this past Spring for the first two sessions you would still profit from these two sessions. These sessions will be led by Father Shawn.

Request for Financial Assistance From Father Francesco in Order to Purchase a Vehicle for Pastoral Ministry upon his return to Tanzania

Father Francesco has been given permission by Archbishop O'Brien to request assistance for his pastoral work when he returns to Tanzania. He has been to St. Patrick's in Napanee, St. Francis de Sales in Smiths Falls, Holy Name of Jesus in Kingston Mills, and St. Paul the Apostle, here in Kingston.

You could still assist Father Francesco this weekend. He will be accepting cash donations or cheques made out to him personally. If we get money for him after Monday the cheque should be made out to St. Mary's and noted for Father Francesco and we will convert it and send him the funds in American money.

Introduction

Fr. Francesco is from the Diocese of Iringa, Tanzania. Together with his parish ministry in Tanzania, he will also be going to the inter-regional tribunal for judicial ministry which is about 100 kilometers away from his diocese. He requires a sure means of transport. The best type and most widely used vehicle for his diocese is the Toyota Land Cruiser.

Parish Life in Iringa

The Diocese of Iringa covers an area of more than 43,318 square kilometers. The Diocese has a population of more than 2,524,245 inhabitants of whom 650,461 are Catholics (as of 2013). There are 37 parishes served by 75 indigenous priests, 30 missionary priests and 4 fidei donum priests.

Nine months after his ordination, he was assigned as a pastor of Wasa Parish (it comprises of 14 villages) for seven years. He usually had Mass at the parish center and then went to two more villages for Mass. His first year of ministry in this parish was very difficult because he had an old car which required repair. Sometimes he could not get home because it had broken. After a year however, he received a new car, a Toyota Land Cruiser Hard Top, which was so useful for his pastoral ministry. With it, he could go to the villages for pastoral ministry without any problem. Even though the roads are very bad, with the Toyota Land Cruiser, he was able to go everywhere without any problem. During that time, and even today, most of the Tanzanian people do not have cars. Hence, most of them depend on the priest's car to go to the hospital if they are seriously sick (especially pregnant women). Always the priest must be ready to rush them to the regional hospital in Iringa. The car also was used to take the faithful (the leaders like CWL, the youth, etc.) to the diocesan centre for meetings. Knowing that he will go back to his diocese for the service of the people, Fr. Francesco is raising the money for a Land Cruiser Hard Top which will greatly help him with his pastoral ministry.

Objectives of the Project

- To ensure adequate religious services to all parishioners throughout the year.
- To provide judicial service at our inter-regional tribunal.
- To take sick people to the hospital whenever it will be needed.
- To take the parishioners to the diocesan Centre for meetings or other functions.

Outcomes of the Project

- Many parishioners will be visited and served in a timely manner.
- It will be easier for Fr. Francesco to offer his service outside his parish (like going to the inter-diocesan tribunal which is almost 100 kilometers away from the diocesan centre).
- Sick persons will be served any time they need help.
- Taking parishioners to the diocesan centre for meetings whenever required.

Total Amount of the Project



Buying a Toyota Land Cruiser from Japan requires a large amount of money. The entire amount would be virtually impossible for Fr. Francesco to raise without our assistance. However, he has made an application to BEGECA, an association which helps missionaries in mission countries to get a car for pastoral ministry at a great discount. The total amount for the Land Cruiser is estimated to be Euro 26,833, which is a very good price for this type of vehicle.

Amount Requested: Fr. Francesco's Diocese has already raised 19,000 Euros for this project which will be sent to BEGECA, in Germany. This amount falls short of the total cost 7,833 Euros. He has already raised 5,000 Euros. Therefore, he humbly requests a donation from you, the people of St. Mary's, for purchasing this vehicle which will be for the good of the people of God in his home diocese of Iringa, Tanzania.

If you would like to donate to Fr. Francesco's project, your cheque payable to Father Francesco Msofu or cash in an envelope with Fr. Francesco's name on it must be in the parish office by Monday noon at the latest. . The envelopes will be given to Father. He needs the time on Monday to change the money into US funds. Unfortunately, because the money is for outside of Canada a tax receipt cannot be issued for it. However, I ask your support for this wonderful young priest and his future work in his home country which needs our help. I thank you in advance for your generosity.
