

Anointing of the Sick: Every First Friday after the 12:10 pm

Mass. Anyone diagnosed with i) a serious illness, ii) newly admitted to hospital, or iii) anyone whose illness has worsened since their last anointing, or iv) who is having serious surgery, or v) for reasons of age should receive the Sacrament of the Sick. The Sacrament is offered every first Friday after the 12:10 pm Mass. The Sacrament is available as needed. Please phone the rectory and let us know and one of the priests will come. If you are at hospital and it is an emergency there is a priest on call 24/7. You just need to tell the nurse or doctor you would like the priest on call to come and they will page them. If no one comes don't hesitate to call the rectory (even in the middle of the night). At night the phone rings in Father Shawn's suite and he will come right away. Anyone seriously ill should be anointed. If you are able to prepare for the Sacrament the best way is to go to confession first. Then you are able to receive all the graces available to you in the anointing and in your reception of Holy Communion.





ST MARY'S REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP: MEET YOUR NEW NEIGHBOURS

On Sunday, November 12th, our parishioners were able to meet the newly arrived members of our second refugee family after 10:30 Mass. Below please find an introduction to our new neighbours, some news on what they are doing during their first month in Canada, and a request for community connections.

Currently, the father of the family, Gerard, and his four sons are beginning English as a Second Language (ESL) at Kingston Employment and Youth Services (KEYS.) Some of the sons have placed in the top level (7/8) of ESL, whereas others will need additional study.

Gerard is a European-qualified veterinarian engineer/technician. When he has completed ESL, he would love to find employment in his field, preferably agricultural veterinary work.

Arnaud-Tresor (25) has completed three years of university in (Business) Management and Administration, and the third year of a program while in Rwanda last year. He intends to continue his studies at St. Lawrence College and then, hopefully, at Queen's.

Faby-Derrick (24) was about to complete his Computer Engineering degree program when he left for Canada. Good news, he is arranging to do his final thesis/dissertation via video conferencing in December of this year. Faby-Derrick is hoping to pursue a Masters program at Queen's.

Amy Doux (22) has completed Grade 12. He, too, is interested in pursuing studies at St. Lawrence College.

Guy Rodrique (19) has completed Grade 11. He intends to complete Grade 12, most likely at Loyola School of Adult and Continuing Education.




