Archbishop Brendan O'Brien is currently the longest serving bishop in Canada.

Early life and ministry

Brendan Michael O'Brien was born in Ottawa, the oldest of the seven children of Redmond and Margaret (née Foran) O'Brien. He attended the University of Ottawa and St. Paul University, where he earned his licentiates in philosophy and theology, before being ordained to the priesthood on June 1, 1968 and celebrated his first Mass at his home parish, St George's Catholic Church (Ottawa).

Father O'Brien then did pastoral work in Ottawa and served as Co-Director of the Diocesan Synod. In 1971 he went to Rome, where he studied at the Pontifical Lateran University's *Accademia Alfonsianum*, from which he obtained a doctorate in moral theology. Father O'Brien, upon his return to Canada in 1975, was a professor at his *alma mater*, St. Paul University, and served as pastor of an Ottawa parish.

Episcopate

On May 6, 1987, Father O'Brien was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Ottawa and Titular Bishop of *Numana* by Pope John Paul II. He received his episcopal consecration on the following June 29, 1987 from Archbishop Joseph-Aurèle Plourde, with Bishops John Beahen and Gilles Bélisle serving as co-consecrators. Bishop O'Brien was later named Bishop of the diocese of Pembroke, Ontario on May 5, 1993, and Archbishop of St. John's, Newfoundland on December 4, 2000.

On June 3, 2007 Pope Benedict XVI, named Archbishop O'Brien to succeed the late Archbishop Anthony G. Meagher as the 14th Bishop and 9th Archbishop of Kingston. Archbishop O'Brien's installation as Kingston's ordinary took place on July 25, 2007.

Description of the Coat of Arms

The ship as the symbol of the Church is here represented by one of the early leather boats used by the Irish monks, such as St. Brendan the Navigator.

The Celtic Cross and green shield stand for the Irish origin of the bearer.

One lion from the red, ancestral O'Brien shield stands on guard in perpetual vigilance.

The coat of arms has a cross with two crossbars, indicating that the bearer is a cardinal or archbishop. The 10 tassels (four rows) on each side of the galero (green hat) indicate the rank of archbishop.

Redimere TempusRedeeming the Time

This expression is found in Ephesians 5:16-17 and Colossians 4:5. These verses develop the theme that the wisdom of God should be manifest in Christian life through prudent action, alertness to God's inspiration in the present time of opportunity and an eagerness for the Lord's design.

The Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, Article 52, quotes the appeal from Ephesians. It urges Christians to redeem the *kairos* – to make available all opportunities for redemption offered here and now. This involves distinguishing eternal realities from their changing expression, in order to be of pastoral service to people today.

French Boys' Choir Concert at St. Mary's Cathedral

Les Petits Chanteurs de Bordeaux is a choir of 55 boys, ages 9 to 20, (mostly 11 to 14 years old) celebrating its 70th anniversary with a Canadian tour of Québec and Ontario. They regularly sing for Mass at home parish in the 11th-century Gothic cathedral of Bordeaux in the southwest of France. They also have concerts throughout the year, and undertake an annual summer tour which brings them to Canada this year. The choir is a member of Pueri cantores, the international student choral organisation for Roman Catholic youth. They are not the same choir that came to St. Mary's from France three summers ago.

As part of their 2018 Canadian tour, the choir will arrive in Kingston on July 14th. They will sing at the 10:30 am Mass here at the cathedral on July 15th and hold an afternoon concert at 2:30 pm in the afternoon. They will leave Kingston early Monday, July 16th. The free will offering at the concert will be divided between the choir and St. Mary's cathedral.



Your kingdom come. Your will be done

The prayer continues: Your kingdom come. We pray that God's kingdom will become present for us in the same way that we ask for his name to be hallowed among us. For when does God not reign, when could there be in him a beginning of what always was and what will never cease to be? What we pray for is that the kingdom promised to us by God will come, the kingdom won by Christ's blood and passion. Then we who formerly were slaves in this world will reign from now on under the dominion of Christ, in accordance

with his promise: Come, O blessed of my Father, receive the kingdom which was prepared for you from the foundation of the world.

However, my dear friends, it could also be that the kingdom of God whose coming we daily wish for is Christ himself, since it is his coming that we long for. He is our resurrection, since we rise again in him; so too he can be thought of as the kingdom of God because we are to reign in him. And it is good that we pray for God's kingdom; for though it is a heavenly kingdom, it is also an earthly one. But those who have already renounced the world are made greater by holding positions of authority in that kingdom.

After this we add: Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven; we pray not that God should do his will, but that we may carry out his will. How could anyone prevent the Lord from doing what he wills? But in our prayer we ask that God's will be done in us, because the devil throws up obstacles to prevent our mind and our conduct from obeying God in all things. So if his will is to be done in us we have need of his will, that is, his help and protection. No one can be strong by his own strength or secure save by God's mercy and forgiveness. Even the Lord, to show the weakness of the human nature which he bore, said: Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me, and then, by way of giving example to his disciples that they should do God's will and not their own, he added: Nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will. All Christ did, all he taught, was the will of God. Humility in our daily lives, an unwavering faith, a moral sense of modesty in conversation, justice in acts, mercy in deed, discipline, refusal to harm others, a readiness to suffer harm, peaceableness with our brothers, a wholehearted love of the Lord, loving in him what is of the Father, fearing him because he is God, preferring nothing to him who preferred nothing to us, clinging tenaciously to his love, standing by his cross with loyalty and courage whenever there is any conflict involving his honor and his name, manifesting in our speech the constancy of our profession and under torture confidence for the fight, and in dying the endurance for which we will be crowned—this is what it means to wish to be a coheir with Christ, to keep God's command; this is what it means to do the will of the Father.


