

#### Pastoral Letter on Sexual Abuse

My dear friends in Christ,

This past week, the priests of the Archdiocese held their annual three-day Convocation. It focused on Priestly Wellness: physical, spiritual, emotional, and ministerial health.

Much of our actual discussion centered around the recent disclosures of past sexual abuse committed by members of the clergy in the United States and elsewhere and the failure of some Church leaders to protect the vulnerable. Our priests spoke of the anger, pain, and confusion that these revelations have brought, both for them and for their parishioners, and I must say that I have been greatly disheartened myself.

In the Archdiocese of Kingston, allegations have been made over the years against some members of the clergy. These allegations have been acted upon, which has resulted in removal from ministry, and, in a few cases, there have been criminal convictions. Having seen the devastation that sexual abuse has caused, we are more committed than ever to prevent further damage and to help survivors seek healing and justice. While we have been spared the widespread scourge of sexual abuse that has plagued some dioceses, our own experience has resulted in strict provisions being put in place to address this issue.

First and foremost, it is necessary to prevent abuse. In this Archdiocese, when candidates present themselves for the priesthood, they are required to undergo a comprehensive psychological evaluation to ascertain their emotional and psycho-social development. Human formation is now an integral part of the seminary curriculum; in fact, it is first among the four pillars of the curriculum – the others being spiritual, intellectual, and pastoral training. Not only seminarians, but all those who are engaged in pastoral ministry, are regularly screened, and police checks are required of all seminarians, priests, and permanent deacons – as well as lay persons who are in "high trust" positions.

As part of our Safe Environment Policy, which is available for review on the Archdiocesan website, there is a Code of Pastoral Conduct, which clearly spells out expectations and the appropriate boundaries that are to be observed, especially when ministering to children, youth, and other vulnerable persons. The Safe Environment Policy also includes a Protocol for Creating a Safe Faith Community and Responding to Cases of Alleged Sexual Misconduct. When allegations of sexual abuse of a minor are reported, the Archbishop does not act alone. A Delegate receives the information, and an Advisory Committee, composed of lay persons with experience in various fields, advises the Archbishop on how to proceed. In recent years, allegations tend to be made directly to the civil authorities, including the police, with whom the Archdiocese has always cooperated. The Archdiocese wants to see justice done and will continue to support survivors.

The sexual abuse of minors, both in society at large and within the Church, has caused grave harm to many people. While we cannot undo the past, it is important for us to recognize the damage that was caused and to provide survivors with whatever practical assistance will bring healing and justice.

At the conclusion of our Priests' Convocation, we held a prayer service for survivors of sexual abuse and for guidance for the Church. I ask you to join us in praying for justice and healing for survivors and for all those affected in our parish communities. May the Holy Spirit guide our efforts in the days ahead, so that trust and confidence may be reestablished among all members of the Church community.
