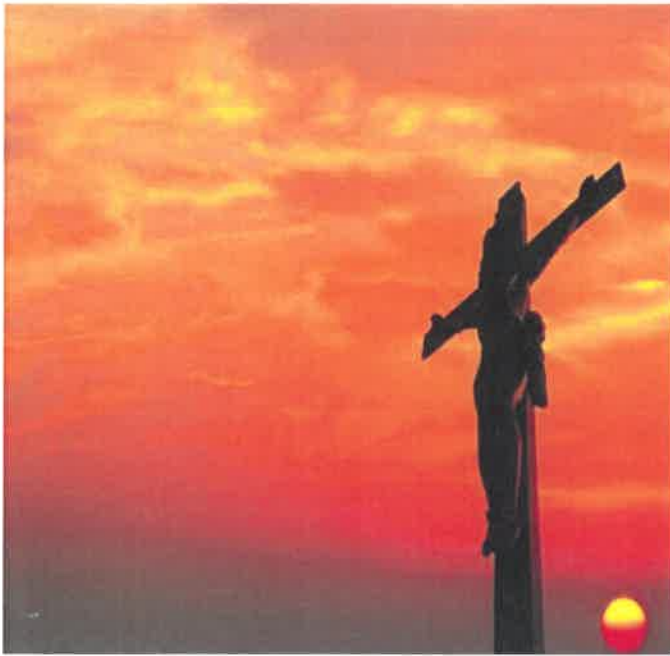

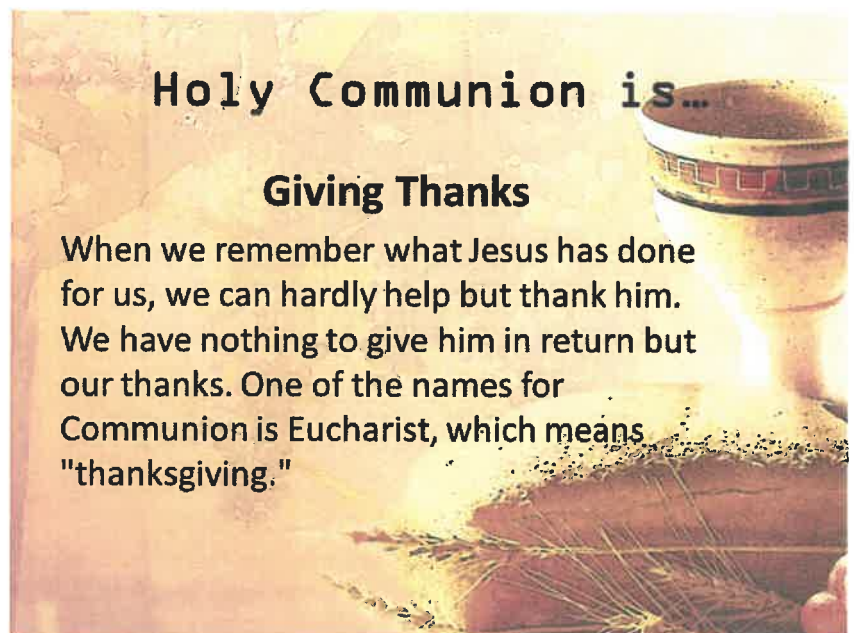

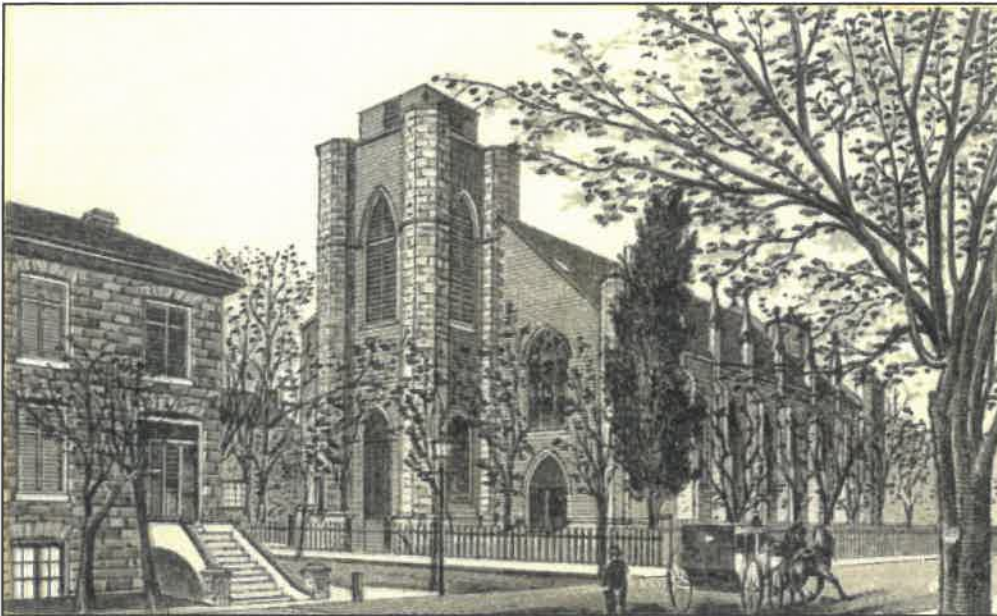

**Archbishop O'Brien's
Homily last Thursday,
October 4th, the 170th
Anniversary of the
Dedication of the Cathedral
(Revelation 21:2-3, 22, 27)**

The Reading:

"I saw a new Jerusalem, the holy city, coming down out of heaven from God, beautiful as a bride prepared to meet her husband. I heard a loud voice from the throne cry out: "This is God's dwelling among men. He shall dwell with them and they shall be his people and he shall be their God who is

always with them." I saw no temple in the city. The Lord, God the Almighty, is its temple – he and the Lamb. But nothing profane shall enter it, nor anyone who is a liar or has done a detestable act. Only those shall enter whose names are inscribed in the book of the living kept by the Lamb." The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Homily:

We have just heard from the Book of Revelation in which John Describes the new Jerusalem promised by Isaiah, an age in which all of creation is to be renewed, the new Jerusalem, the holy city comes down to us, it will be the dwelling place of God with us humans.

And as you perhaps noticed from the reading, there is no temple in this city because everything in the new Jerusalem will praise God. Nothing profane or detestable shall enter it. It is something which God will bring about; a great sign of hope for those living in a less than perfect age. And while it is to be the work that God brings about; it is also something to which we are called to grow into.

St. Augustine in a sermon he gave on the occasion of a dedication of a church said: "This is our house of prayer but we are a house of God." And the Rite for the Dedication of a church expresses this dual emphasis. The church building is sprinkled with holy water but so are the people, a reminder that we, the people, form a spiritual temple.

The walls of the church are incensed signifying that it is a house of prayer but so are the members of the faith community incensed as a sign of their baptismal dignity and how together they are the living stones of a spiritual edifice.

St. Augustine talks about how the church building is made of timber and stone taken from the woods and mountains. The timber and stone must fit together in an orderly plan, must be joined in perfect harmony, must give each other support or no one would enter the building because they would be afraid of it falling down in ruins.

Just as the timbers and stones used in the construction of the building must fit together so in the coming to faith of believers their instruction, baptism and formation shapes, levels and smooths them. For Christians do not make a house of God until they are one in charity.

While the building of a church is something physical there is a spiritual counterpart. We see here the finished product of stone and wood, so too should we see in the lives of believers the handiwork of God's grace.

So tonight as we celebrate the 170th anniversary of the dedication of this Cathedral, we give thanks for the work of all those who constructed and supported this magnificent edifice which is our house of prayer today. At the same time, we thank God for the countless individuals and families who over these 170 years have shared faith, hope and charity and formed a house of God, a community of faith. May we continue to build on that legacy.
