

November is the month when we traditionally remember the Holy Souls in Purgatory praying: "Eternal Rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and all the souls of the Faithful departed, rest in peace. Amen."

GREAT REFLECTION ON PRAYER WHILE SUFFERING OR WHEN WE FEEL OUR PRAYER HAS NOT BEEN HEARD

From St. Augustine's Letter to Proba We do not know how to pray as we ought

Perhaps you may still ask why St Paul said when we cannot choose words in order to pray properly, since it is impossible that he or those to whom he wrote should not have known the Lord's Prayer.

Yet Paul himself was not exempt from such ignorance. When, to prevent him from becoming swollen-headed over the greatness of the revelations that had been given to him, he was given in addition a thorn in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to buffet him, he asked the Lord three times to take it away from him. Surely that was not knowing to pray as he ought? For in the end he heard the Lord's reply, telling him why even such a great saint's prayer had to be refused: My grace is sufficient for you: my power is at its best in weakness. (2 Corinthians 12:9)

So when we are suffering afflictions that might be doing us either good or harm, we do not know how to pray as we ought. But because they are hard to endure and painful, because they are contrary to our nature (which is weak) we, like all mankind, pray to have our afflictions taken from us. At least, though, we owe this much respect to the Lord our God, that if he does not take our afflictions away we should not consider ourselves ignored and neglected, but should hope to gain some greater good through the patient acceptance of suffering. For my power is at its best in weakness.

Scripture says this so that we should not be proud of ourselves if our prayer is heard, when we ask for something it would be better for us not to get; and so that we should not become utterly dejected if we are not given what we ask for, despairing of God's mercy towards us: it might be that what we have been asking for could have brought us some still greater affliction, or it could have brought us the kind of good fortune that brings corruption and ruin. In such cases, it is clear that we cannot know how to pray as we ought.

Hence if anything happens contrary to our prayer, we ought to bear the disappointment patiently, give thanks to God, and be sure that it was better for God's will to be done than our own. The Mediator himself has given us an example of this. When he had prayed, My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass me by, he transformed the human will that was in him because he had assumed human nature and added Nevertheless, let it be as you, not I, would have it. (Matthew 26:39; Luke 22:42) Thus, truly, By the obedience of one man many have been made righteous. (Romans 5:19)

SPECIAL MASS

THE FEAST OF ALL SOULS, FRIDAY, NOV. 2ND, AT 7 PM FULL CHOIR; BEAUTIFUL SOLEMN CHANTED MASS

All Souls Day is a solemn celebration in the Roman Catholic Church commemorating all of those who have died and are now in Purgatory, being cleansed of their venial sins and the temporal punishments for the mortal sins that they had confessed, and being made pure before entering into the presence of God in Heaven.

On All Souls Day and at Christmas each priest is permitted to celebrate up to three Masses and the faithful are permitted to attend and receive Holy Communion at all three. The norm is to celebrate only one Mass per day, or attend one Mass per day and receive Holy Communion once per day. However, on special occasions like funerals or weddings, at the bedside of a sick loved one, one can receive a second time. (See directions below)

Here at St. Mary's we will have our usual Masses at 7:45 am, 12:10 pm and a beautiful chanted liturgy at 7 pm in the evening. You are permitted to receive Holy Communion at all three Masses

Detailed guidance from the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* and other authoritative books for the ceremonies regarding the feast of All Souls.

DIRECTIONS

The Visit to the Cemetery

394. On the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed the Church gathers in solemn suffrage for the souls in purgatory, and the liturgy should express this clearly. The colour of the day is black or violet. If the commemoration falls on a Sunday, it is celebrated on that day and the propers for All Souls replace the Sunday texts.

395. A sense of sobriety and restraint should characterize All Souls Day. Flowers are not placed on or near the main altar, and the organ or other instruments are only used to sustain singing.²

396. On this day every priest may celebrate three Requiem Masses: (1) for a specific intention, (2) for all the faithful departed and (3) for the Holy Father's intentions. This privilege was granted by Pope Benedict XV in *Incruentum altaris* (1915) and has never been revoked.

The celebrant may choose from the three Masses provided in the Roman Missal. According to the options available in the wide range of readings provided in the lectionary, the homily may well develop: our paschal hope of eternal life; the reality and meaning of purgatory; the propitiatory and impetratory nature of the Eucharistic Sacrifice; and the need to pray for the dead as an act of faith, hope and charity within the Body of Christ.³ The celebrant should also announce the indulgences granted on this day.⁴

The breviary recommends the public celebration of Lauds and/or Vespers on All Souls Day.⁵ As much as possible of the hour should be sung, preferably led by cantor(s) and choir. It may he found more convenient to join the celebration of Lauds or Vespers to a Mass, either combining it with the rite of Mass or adding it to the Mass.⁶

399. In some places, it is customary to visit the cemetery to bless the graves of the faithful, even to celebrate Mass there, if this can be carried out with proper dignity and under suitable conditions. The Requiem Mass, Lauds, Vespers or a para-liturgy is followed by the sprinkling and incensing of burial sites.

Footnotes: 1. Wearing white on All Souls Day tends to make the liturgy a repetition of All Saints Day. However white would be appropriate in a culture where it is the color of mourning, for example, in Japan.


