

Why does the Christmas Season Extend to January 13th this year?

As you know the Christmas season begins with December 25th and extends for traditional 12 days of celebration to January 6th when we celebrate the coming of the Kings/Wisemen/Magi. This year Jan. 6th falls on a Sunday. In contemporary times if it does not fall on Sunday, Epiphany is celebrated on the Sunday following January 1. If that is January 6th or less, (Jan 2nd to Jan 5th) then we have another full week of Christmas Season until the following Sunday when we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. If Epiphany, the Sunday following New Years, falls on Jan. 7th or 8th, then that Monday we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord and the Christmas Season is shorter ending on the 8th or 9th. Since January 6th is falls on a Sunday this year, this year we have the longest Christmas Season possible.

What exactly is Cursillo?

St. John Paul II said Cursillo is "an instrument raised up by God for the proclamation of the gospel of our time".

"Here is your role in the Church: to create clusters of believers who will carry the message of salvation everywhere, showing the seriousness of your opinion not by imposing it, but by a strong testimony". (Pope St. John Paul II)

Cursillo is a movement within the Roman Catholic Church

Its name comes from the Spanish word "Cursillo" which means small course. Its original full name is "Cursillo de Cristiandad" (short course in Christianity). However, it is not a theoretical course nor a traditional retreat; it is best described as an experience. An experience that leads to discover and better live what is fundamental in Christianity

During the Cursillo's 3-days, participants share a profound experience of Christian life...

The week-end starts on a Thursday night and ends on Sunday night. During these three days, we learn:

- a) To get to know ourselves (encounter with self),
- b) To experience the presence and love of Jesus Christ (encounter with God),
- c) To see the good that can provide a loving and caring Christian community. (encounter with others).


...To help to influence their environment by the force of their testimony

The Cursillo Movement (CM) is an apostolic movement. Its goal is to share with the community the essence of Christianity and Christian values and in this way gradually transform the community from within. To convey its objective, the CM uses the expression "leavening society with the gospel" and it is counting primarily on the testimony of friendship and the deepening of the personal conversion of its members.

A CALL TO ALL THE MEN OF THE PARISH TO JOIN FATHER SHAWN IN LIVING EXODUS 90

I want to invite you on a journey with me called Exodus 90, that starts on January 21St and ends on Easter Sunday. Over 90 days, we'll walk as brothers on this path to freedom, leading us closer to Christ, and becoming MORE like the men the Church needs today.

The goal of Exodus 90 is to achieve the freedom necessary to fully engage the love of God and love of neighbour we are called to. The freedom sought by men accepting the roadmap of Exodus 90 is not limited to sexual liberty, but also the enslavement to countless temptations advanced by our culture: materialism, narcissism (or selfishness), alcoholism, and most significantly, spiritual coldness. Exodus 90 is based on

a challenging 90-day period of purification, a dying to self, which is supported by a fraternity of like-minded men for greater interior freedom and, eventually, a more purified and selfless love. The experience is fantastic for all Catholic men and especially those discerning a vocation, for men preparing for marriage, for men struggling with an addiction of any kind, or for a man who has difficulty finding God and desires to radically unite himself to his Heavenly Father. The work of Exodus 90 is effective for the realization of overall self-mastery and openness to the will and mystery of God.

Exodus 90 is not primarily a program of penance or self-abasement. It is a program for men who seek, together, to strive for a more perfect freedom. This is the cornerstone of the exercise and much will be lost if that is forgotten. Most men, when invited to join Exodus 90, are filled with fear and anxiety - the first step is overcoming the fear of loss of control and giving control to God.

Because of our addictions: to work, sports, emails, social media, Netflix, even some to pornography, many men have lost the freedom to see the real things Christ intends for their lives. Exodus 90 is not just for men who struggle with these temptations but it is for all men who seek true freedom in Christ, therefore, it is for all men.

This is a program of prayer, self-discipline and fraternity.


