WHY IS LENT (AND THEREFORE EASTER) SO LATE THIS YEAR?

Ash Wednesday is March 6th this year. It rarely is this late. Why does it move around every year? This is an excellent question. Easter Sunday is calculated according to the lunar calendar following the Jewish calendar which was based on the cycle of the moon. Easter Sunday is always the first Sunday, after the first full moon after the Spring Equinox. The Spring Equinox is fixed on March 21st. So if there is a full moon the following day and the next day is Sunday, then that Sunday would be Easter Sunday; the earliest we could possibly have it, March 23rd. This year it is the latest we can possibly have it. The full moon in March is the 20th, the day before the Spring Equinox. So the next full moon is not until April 19th. The following Sunday then is Easter Sunday, April 21.


Organ Scholarships Available for Parish Musicians

Oct. 19 Afternoon departure from Toronto to Tel Aviv.

Oct. 20 Moming arrival in Tel Aviv. Upon meeting our guide we embark on a panoramic view of Jaffa and are transferred to our hotel in Galilee. Time for rest, Mass, dinner and overnight.



After breakfast we depart for Tiberias. We travel by boat on the Sea of Galliee, visit Capernaum, home of St. Peter and the site of Jesus' preaching, on to Tabgha to see the Church of the Multiplication with its beautiful 5th century fish mosaic. We also visit the Church of the Primacy and celebrate Mass on the Mount of the Beatitudes. Continue to Cesarea Philippi, where Jesus revealed to His disciples for the first time that He was indeed Messiah. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.



This morning we start our tour in Cana - the site of Jesus' first miracle. Here we celebrate marriage Oct. 22 renewal ceremony. We move on to Nazareth where we celebrate Mass at the Basilica of Annunciation and visit Mary's Well and St. Joseph's church. We also visit the Nazareth village wherewe experience village life in the Galilee in the time of Jesus. In the afternoon we ascend Mount Tabor - the Mount of Transfiguration.

Oct. 23 This morning we depart Galilee for Judea and the area of Jerusalem. En route we visit Halfa and Mt. Carmel, the "burning place" where Elijah called fire down to confound the prophets of Baal. Here we celebrate Mass. We continue via Cesarea by the Sea to Judea for our dinner and overnight.



Today's journey takes us to the ancient city of Jerusalem: St. Ann's Church, Pool of Bethesda, Oct. 24 Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of the Flagellation and the Arch of Ecce Homo, the convent of the sisters of Zion. We continue with the Stations of the Cross - Via Dolorosa to the Holy Sepulchre. Mass will be celebrated in one of the many churches of Jerusalem. In the afternoon we visit the Western Wall, also called the "Walling Wall". We see the place of the Mosque of Omar and El Aksar. Rutum to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

We continue our tour of sacred places in Jerusalem. We visit the Mount of Olives: the Church of all Nations, the Church of Maria Magdalene, Dominus Flevit Church, Chapel of the Ascension, Garden of Gethsemane, Mary's Tomb, Church of the Pater Noster. We continue to the village of Bethany with the tomb of Lazarus (time permitting). In the afternoon we visit Mount Zion with the Upper Room (Room of the Last Supper) and the Church of St. Peter's in Gallicantu. Return to our hotel for dinner and ovemight.



Oct 26 Today we will drive to Emmaus where Jesus appeared following His Resurrection. We will then pray the Rosary together in the Church of Dormition, where Mary was assumed into heaven. Free time, dinner and overnight,

Oct. 27 Today we visit Bethlehem - where Jesus was born, celebrating Christmas Mass in one of the grottos. We visit the Manger, the Crusaders' Cloister and the Grotto of St. Jerome -Shepherd's field. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

This morning we leave for a full day excursion to Masada, the Dead Sea, Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in 1947. Time for swimming in the Dead Sea. Continue to Jericho, the oldest continuously inhabited city the world. After Mass in Jericho we stop at the Jordan River in Qasr al-Yahud, where Jesus was baptized. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

After breakfast we take a short drive to Ein Karem, the picturesque village where Mary visited her Oct. 29 cousin Elizabeth. Here we will visit the Church of the Visitation. Return to Jerusalem, free time for leisure.


Oct. 30 After breakfast we are transferred to the airport in Tel Aviv for a flight to Torento. Evening arrival.
