

Ms. McLean's presentation "Living on the Street: Homelessness, Street Poverty, and Human Trafficking" was very passionate and informative, detailing some of her personal history in beginning and volunteering at the Street Mission. An animated question and answer period followed the presentation.

One of our newest Saints: Canonized last Sunday, October 13TH, 2019



John Henry Newman

(21 February 1801 – 11 August 1890) was an English theologian And poet, first an Anglican priest and after converting became a Roman Catholic priest and cardinal. He was an important and controversial figure in the religious history of England in the 19th century. In 1845 Newman officially left the Church of England and his teaching post at Oxford University and was received into the Catholic Church. He was quickly ordained as a priest and continued as an influential religious leader, based in Birmingham. In1879, he was created a cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in recognition of his services to the cause of the Catholic Church in England.

Newman was a literary figure of note: his major writings include the *Tracts for the Times* (1833–1841), his autobiography *Apologia Pro Vita Sua* (1865–1866), the *Grammar of Assent* (1870), and the poem "The Dream of Gerontius" (1865), which was set to music in 1900 by Edward Elgar. He wrote the popular hymns "Lead, Kindly Light" and "Praise to the Holiest in the Height" (taken from *Gerontius*).

Newman's beatification was officially proclaimed by Pope Benedict XVI on 19 September 2010 during his visit to the United Kingdom. His canonisation was officially approved by Pope Francis on 12 February 2019, and took place on 13 October 2019.

Cardinal Newman, St. John Henry Newman, is the patron saint of the Newman Houses around the world. They are the Catholic presence on non-Catholic university campus including here at Queen's University. Newman House is located at 192 Frontenac Street.

A Short Road to Perfection by John Henry Cardinal Newman September 27, 1856

It is the saying of holy men that, if we wish to be perfect, we have nothing more to do than to perform the ordinary duties of the day well. A short road to perfection—short, not because easy, but because pertinent and intelligible. There are no short ways to perfection, but there are sure ones.

I think this is an instruction which may be of great practical use to persons like ourselves. It is easy to have vague ideas what perfection is, which serve well enough to talk about, when we do not intend to aim at it; but as soon as a person really desires and sets about seeking it himself, he is dissatisfied with anything but what is tangible and clear, and constitutes some sort of direction towards the practice of it.

We must bear in mind what is meant by perfection. It does not mean any extraordinary service, anything out of the way, or especially heroic—not all have the opportunity of heroic acts, of sufferings—but it means what the word perfection ordinarily means. By perfect we mean that which has no flaw in it, that which is complete, that which is consistent, that which is sound—we mean the opposite to imperfect. As we know well what imperfection in religious service means, we know by the contrast what is meant by perfection.

He, then, is perfect who does the work of the day perfectly, and we need not go beyond this to seek for perfection. You need not go out of the round of the day.

I insist on this because I think it will simplify our views, and fix our exertions on a definite aim. If you ask me what you are to do in order to be perfect, I say, first—Do not lie in bed beyond the due time of rising; give your first thoughts to God; make a good visit to the Blessed Sacrament; say the Angelus devoutly; eat and drink to God's glory; say the Rosary well; be recollected; keep out bad thoughts; make your evening meditation well; examine yourself daily; go to bed in good time, and you are already perfect.
