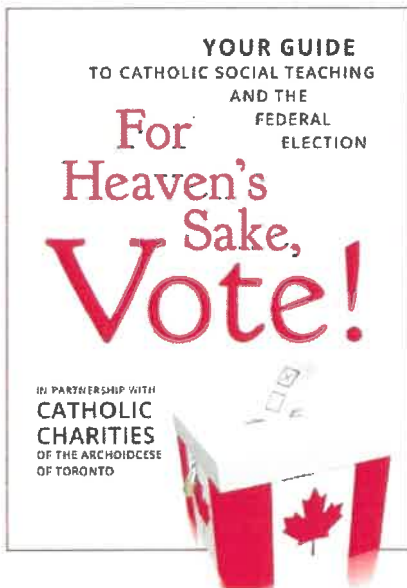


MANY THANKS TO ST. MARY'S CATHOLIC WOMEN'S LEAGUE

SOMETHING TO REALLY PONDER!

A very inspiring reflection by Saint Vincent de Paul, priest, (1551 – 1660 AD) whose feast day we celebrated on September 27th.
(Epist. 2546: Correspondance, entretiens, documents, Paris 1922-1925, 7)

Serving the poor is to be our first preference

Even though the poor are often rough and unrefined, we must not judge them from external appearances nor from the mental gifts they seem to have received. On the contrary, if you consider the poor in the light of faith, then you will observe that they are taking the place of the Son of God who chose to be poor. Although in his passion he almost lost the appearance of a man and was considered a fool by the Gentiles and a stumbling block by the Jews, he showed them that his mission was to preach to the poor: He sent me to preach the good news to the poor. We also ought to have this same spirit and imitate

Christ's actions, that is, we must take care of the poor, console them, help them, support their cause.

Since Christ willed to be born poor, he chose for himself disciples who were poor. He made himself the servant of the poor and shared their poverty. He went so far as to say that he would consider every deed which either helps or harms the poor as done for or against himself. Since God surely loves the poor, he also loves those who love the poor. For when one person holds another dear, he also includes in his affection anyone who loves or serves the one he loves. That is why we hope that God will love us for the sake of the poor. So when we visit the poor and needy, we try to be understanding where they are concerned. We sympathize with them so fully that we can echo Paul's words: I have become all things to all men. Therefore, we must try to be stirred by our neighbors' worries and distress. We must beg God to pour into our hearts sentiments of pity and compassion and to fill them again and again with these dispositions.

It is our duty to prefer the service of the poor to everything else and to offer such service as quickly as possible. If a needy person requires medicine or other help during prayer time, do whatever has to be done with peace of mind. Offer the deed to God as your prayer. Do not become upset or feel guilty because you interrupted your prayer to serve the poor. God is not neglected if you leave him for such service. One of God's works is merely interrupted so that another can be carried out. So when you leave prayer to serve some poor person, remember that this very service is performed for God. Charity is certainly greater than any rule. Moreover, all rules must lead to charity. Since she is a noble mistress, we must do whatever she commands. With renewed devotion, then, we must serve the poor, especially outcasts and beggars. They have been given to us as our masters and patrons.

WHY AN AUTOMATIC DEBIT PLAN?

Automatic Debit allows St. Mary's parishioners to make their regular Sunday offering using "Direct Debit" system. Automatic Debit is an option, not a requirement! It is being used throughout the Archdiocese of Kingston. We would like to make it available to those St. Mary's parishioners who would like to take advantage of it. When you participate in the automatic debit system, your regular Sunday offerings are only withdrawn from your account **once** a month, on or about the 30th day of each month and deposited into the parish account. It does not include any special collections including cathedral restorations/preservations.

You will be able to contribute to all special collections, cathedral restorations/preservations using your envelopes.

WILL I STILL USE ENVELOPES?

Envelopes will continue to be issued to all parishioners who request them. Those who choose to use the automatic debit system can simply write PAD (pre-authorized debit) on their regular offertory envelope and drop them into the collection basket. You can also use your envelopes for the special collections not covered by your automatic debit offering.



BENEFITS FOR YOU & FOR ST. MARY'S CATHEDRAL

Automatic Debit is convenient. Your offering is deducted automatically. You will no longer need to search for your cheque book, buy cheques to use for your Church offerings, or stop and withdraw cash from the bank on the way to Mass.

Automatic debit allows you to support St. Mary's when you are away — a benefit for the church since expenses continue all year long. Most importantly, it's safe and secure. You are protected by very strict banking rules that guarantee your money and account is safe. It's flexible; you can increase, decrease or withdraw from the program at any time simply by dropping a signed note into the collection basket or Parish office 30 days prior to the

next withdrawal.

HOW DO I ENROLL IN AUTOMATIC DEBIT? Decide the amount of your monthly offertory contribution to be withdrawn from your bank account every month.

Fill out the **Automatic Debit Authorization** below. Also, include a blank cheque marked "VOID" and place both in a sealed envelope. Place the envelope in the collection basket or drop it by the parish office or mail it in. Strict confidentiality is always observed in all parishioner financial transactions.
