



The Easter Sequence, known as Victimæ paschali laudes in Latin, is a beautiful and ancient poem, telling a short narrative story of Resurrection morn, set to a wonderful Gregorian chant melody. Since the liturgical reforms of Vatican II, sequences are only appointed for three feasts (Easter, Pentecost, and Corpus Christi).

Christians, praise the paschal victim! Offer thankful sacrifice!


Christ the Lamb has saved the sheep, Christ the just one paid the price, Reconciling sinners to the Father.


DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION


