
# Rite of Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament





## **ORGAN PRELUDE**

Please stand, singing as the presider enters, carrying the Luna with the host.



**Please kneel** as the presider places the Luna with the Host into the monstrance on the altar. Once the presider has reached the front of the altar and kneels, all sing:



O, Saving Victim, who opens wide the door of heaven, Hostile armies press, give strength; bear aid.

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To the One and Triune Lord, may there be everlasting glory; May he, who gives life without end, give to us in our homeland.

After the presider has incensed the monstrance, he will adore briefly before standing and walking to the ambo to start the reading(s). If the Gospel is to be proclaimed, the presider will instruct all to stand. This Scripture is to provide the basis for our meditation during the silence that follows.

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#### Please kneel or be seated.


After the reading(s) are completed, the presider and altar server(s) will go to their assigned seating for a time of silent Adoration.

#### Please kneel.


Once the silent period of individual adoration is completed, the presider and altar server will return to the front of the altar. While the presider incenses the monstrance, all sing:

All remain kneeling while the presider elevates the monstrance in Benediction.

The presider returns to his place and kneels, leading the Divine Praises. **Repeat after each invocation:**
