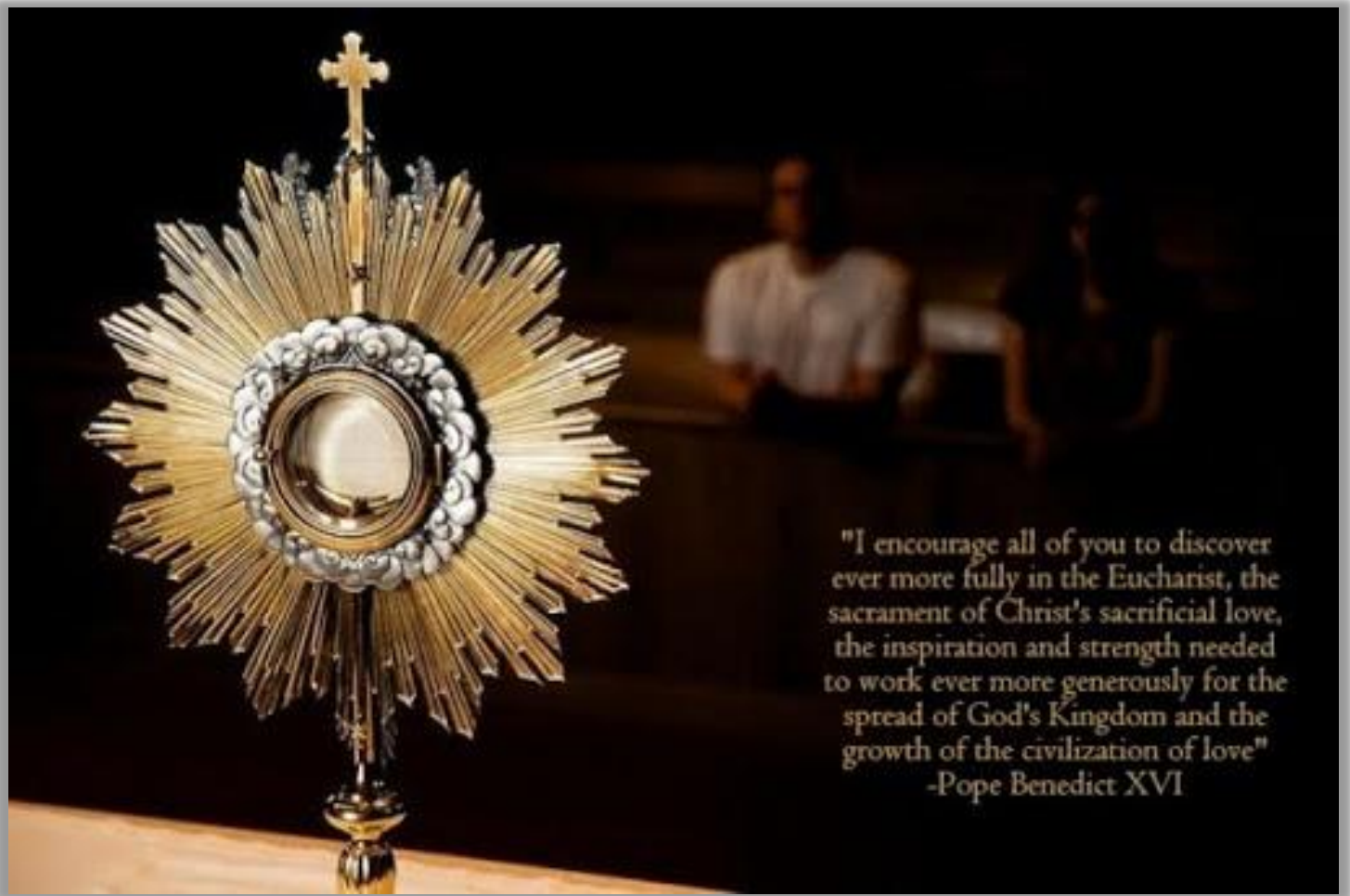


ADORATION, EXPOSITION, AND BENEDICTION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

ORGAN PRELUDE

Please stand, singing as the presider enters, carrying the Luna with the host.

HYMN

Excerpt from the Sequence for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

1. Praise, O Zion, Christ our glory;
To the Shepherd let us sing,
Tell to all the world the story;
Laud with all our might the King.
Bread of life and source of living!
Lacking, still our praises ring.
2. This our special theme for singing,
Christ the Lamb for us was slain.
At the paschal meal he taught us,
To the twelve he made it plain:
Flesh as food for us was giving,
Therefore let your faith not wane.

*Please kneel as the presider places the Luna with the Host into the monstrance on the altar.
Once the presider has reached the front of the altar and kneels, all sing:*

before standing and walking to the ambo to start the reading(s).*

If the Gospel is to be proclaimed, the presider will instruct all to stand.

This Scripture is to provide the basis for our meditation during the silence that follows.

Please kneel or be seated.

After the reading(s) are completed, the presider and altar server(s) will go to their assigned seating for a time of silent Adoration.

Adoration

Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament

Please kneel.

Once the silent period of individual adoration is completed, the presider and altar server will return to the front of the altar.

While the presider incenses the monstrance, all sing:

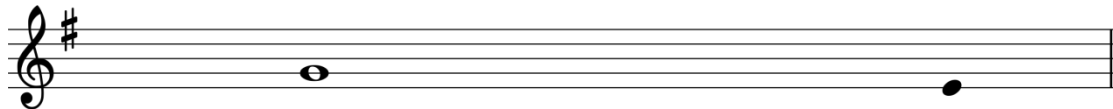

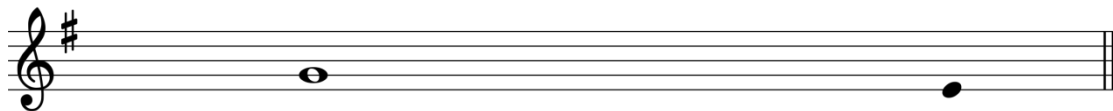
*Down in adoration falling

The presider returns to his place and kneels, leading the Divine Praises.

Blessed be the Name of Jesus.

Blessed be his most Sacred Heart.

Blessed be his most Precious Blood.

Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most holy.

Blessed be her holy and Immaculate Conception.

Blessed be her glorious Assumption.

Blessed be the name of Mary, virgin and mother.

Blessed be St. Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Blessed be God in his Angels and in his Saints.
