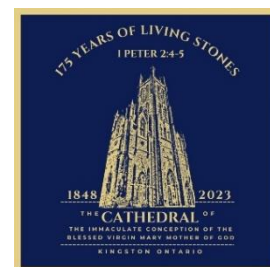

“Palliative care is an approach that improves the quality of life of patients (adults and children) and their families who are facing problems associated with life-threatening illness. It prevents and relieves suffering through the early identification, correct assessment and treatment of pain and other problems, whether physical, psychosocial or spiritual.”

The Joint Ad hoc Committee on Palliative Care of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops published “Horizons of Hope: A Toolkit for Catholic Parishes on Palliative Care”. The fully accessible toolkit is designed for those seeking to learn more about palliative care and Catholic Church teaching on end-of-life questions through video resources and reflection questions. The program covers the understanding of the human experience of dying and death, discerning and making decisions at the end of life, accompanying those at the end of life, and supporting and integrating all those on the margins within the wider community.

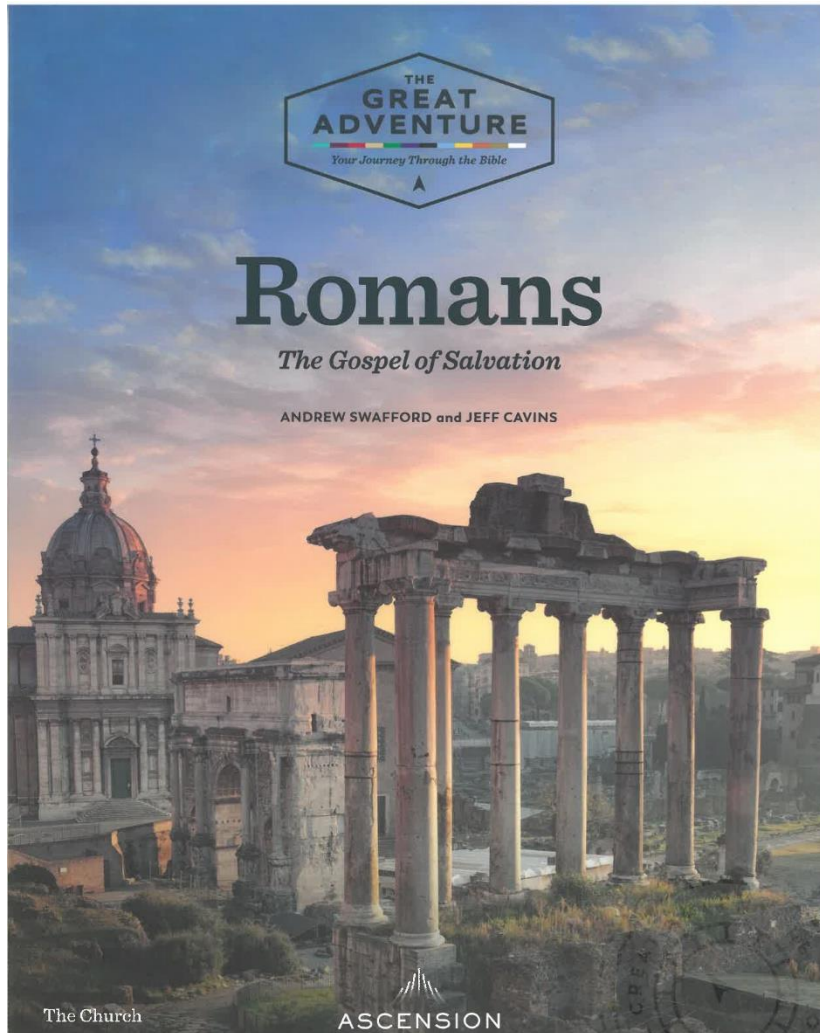
