# CORUPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION, HERE AT ST. MARY'S, AFTER THE 10:30 AM HOLY SACRIFICE OF THE MASS ON SUNDAY JUNE 1, 2024

The Feast of Corpus Christi, also known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, observed this year on June 1<sup>st</sup>, celebrates the institution of the Eucharist. The Corpus Christi procession is a centuries-old tradition of the Catholic

faith to process the Real Presence of Jesus — the Eucharist — in public. The feast of Corpus Christi was established in Liege, Belgium, in 1247 A.D. Pope Urban IV extended it to the universal Church almost two decades later, and the Corpus Christi procession followed soon after. Centuries later, the tradition continues at many parishes throughout the world. We have just be generously gifted with a beautiful Processional canopy in memory of Mary Jane McCarthy, of our parish, who died this January.

On June 1<sup>st</sup> we will process the Blessed Sacrament on the sidewalks surrounding the cathedral and then have a few minutes of Adoration on the steps of the cathedral and then process back into the cathedral for Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Please plan on coming to the 10:30 am Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on June 1<sup>st</sup> and joining the procession after.

God's presence is so much to us as His people. God was present to us in the beginning of creation when He formed us out of the dust. He also was present to other important biblical figures, including Abraham when God called him to be father to a nation in his older years; and Moses, who was asked to lead his people out of Egypt. The presence of God is a presence that shows forth the love of God in creation, in salvation, in making a covenant with his people. The ultimate sealing of God's covenant with His people came in the form of offering His only Son, Jesus, through the institution of the Eucharist, His Body and Blood.

Offering His Body and shedding His Blood for our sake, for our salvation, is the ultimate covenant that could ever be made with the human race. That is why the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is so crucial, so important. All of our lives centre around Jesus' promise to be with us always, nourishing us here on our earthly journey so we could long for and yearn for that presence that is eternal.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI called the Corpus Christi feast and procession important opportunities for Catholics to reaffirm their faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. "With awareness of being inadequate because of our sins, but needing to be nourished by the love that the Lord offers us in the Eucharistic sacrament … We renew our faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist," he said. (Homily, June 11, 2009 in the square outside St. John Laterin Basilcia Rome)

In his 2003 encyclical on the Eucharist, "Ecclesia de Eucharistia," St. John Paul II wrote that "the worship of the Eucharist outside of the Mass is of inestimable value for the life of the Church. This

worship is strictly linked to the celebration of the Eucharistic Sacrifice. The presence of Christ under the sacred species reserved after Mass — a presence which lasts as long as the species of bread and of wine remain — derives from the celebration of the sacrifice and is directed toward communion, both sacramental and spiritual."

#### **Church teaching on the Eucharist**

The Catholic Church professes that in the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.... For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink" (Jn 6:51-55). The whole Christ is truly present, body, blood, soul, and divinity, under the appearances of bread and wine — the glorified Christ who rose from the dead after dying for our sins. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

"By the consecration, the transubstantiation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is brought about. Under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true, real, and substantial manner: His Body and His Blood, with His soul and His divinity" (CCC 1413).

"The Catholic Church has always offered and still offers to the sacrament of the Eucharist the cult of adoration, not only during Mass, but also outside of it, reserving the consecrated hosts with the utmost care, exposing them to the solemn veneration of the faithful, and carrying them in procession" (CCC 1378).

May 4<sup>th</sup>, 10 am, here at the Cathedral the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will be offered to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the closing of the St. Joseph School of Nursing here in Kingston at Hotel Dieu in 1974 A.D.

The Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph (aka the Hotel Dieu Sisters) came to Kingston in 1847 A.D. just as the typhoid epidemic struck. Much heroic nursing service has taken place on the grounds of Hotel Dieu since that time. The St. Joseph Nursing School was founded in 1912 A.D. and closed 1974 A.D. The 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of their final class is this year and this special Mass will be held to commemorate it. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will be offered in great gratitude to God for all the Sisters and all the lay nurses whose faith, regard for the dignity of human life, compassionate healing service met all those who had the occasion to be within the walls of Hotel Dieu since the sisters arrival in 1847 A.D. and especially the nurses formed in the St. Joseph School of Nursing and



throughout their nursing careers. Please feel free to join us here at the cathedral for this Holy Mass of Gratitude.

#### Pray for Vocations

Today we celebrate what is traditionally called Good Shepherd Sunday because we read the section of Jesus, the Good Shepherd in the Gospel of John 10:11-18. This Sunday we are reminded to pray for vocations to the priesthood and to pray for our three seminarians here in the Archdiocese of Kingston.

The Archdiocese urgently needs priests who are willing to devote their lives to the service of God and his people in our local Church. Without priests to offer the Mass, celebrate the Sacraments, preach the Word of God, and provide pastoral leadership in our parishes, the Church cannot fulfil her evangelizing mission of bringing Christ to the world.

Please pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood from the men in our Archdiocese and especially for Jude Thusiar, soon to be ordained a deacon in May of this year and if it be God's most holy will, a priest next year. Jude was a student at Queen's University and graduated as a mechanical engineer. The cathedral is his home base in the Archdiocese. Savio Kocherry and Will Danahy are both from Belleville with St. Michael the Archangel as their home parish in the Archdiocese.
