Veronica's Veil Winter Overnight Shelter for Men

With the onset of the shorter days and slightly cooler temperatures, thoughts turn to the coming winter and the plight of the homeless during the cold winter months. In order to help alleviate the homelessness crisis, Veronica's Veil Shelter will reopen for its third season on Thursday January 2, 2025. It will be open each night from 9 pm to 8 am until April 30, 2025. As in previous years, volunteers are needed to staff each of the three four-hour shifts: 8:30 pm to 12:30 am, 12:30 am to 4:30 am and 4:30 am to 8:30 am. Training sessions will be provided for new volunteers in the upcoming weeks. I am also making inquiries about training sessions in first aid and crisis management.

All volunteers at the shelter must be screened for High Trust ministry according to the Screening Policy of the Archdiocese of Kingston. If you haven't been screened and wish to volunteer, please contact me. If you have already been screened, the only requirement to maintain your current screening status is to complete an annual Offence Declaration for 2024. Please see the attached document and return the signed form if you haven't already done so.

I hope you will prayerfully consider volunteering once again this winter season. I also ask that you reach out to anyone you know who may be interested in volunteering at the shelter. Perhaps you and a good friend or family member could work together on one shift? Please let me know if you can help out again this year as well as your availability, which day / shift you prefer.

Thank you in advance for your assistance in this very important outreach to those who are in need. I look forward to working with everyone again this season. If you are unable to help at this time please keep the shelter very much in your prayers.
