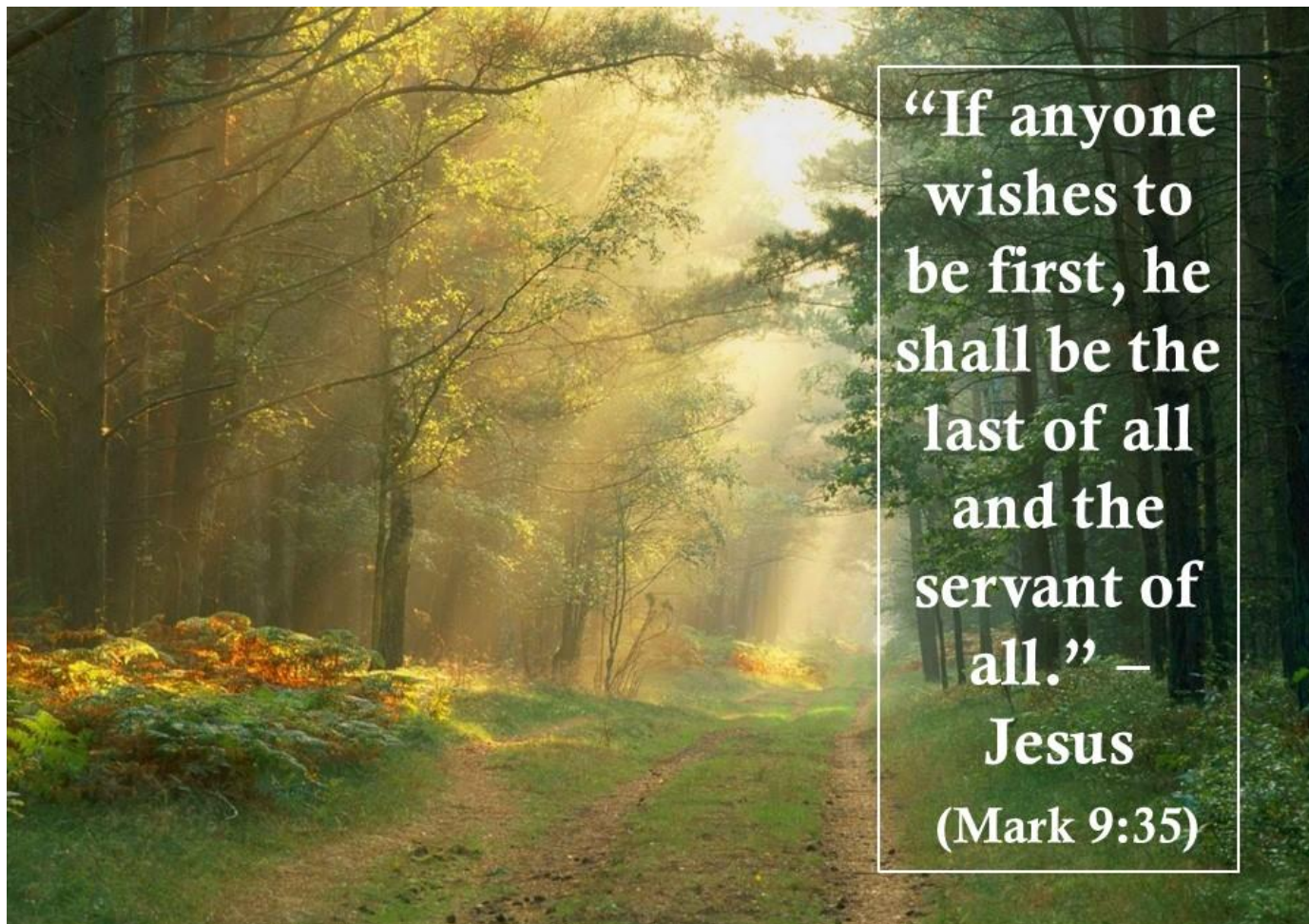

Taizé Prayer for Peace

Friday, October 4, 7:30 pm here in the Cathedral



Join St. Mary's Cathedral Taizé Schola under the direction of Domenico Sanfilippo. Taizé Prayer is an evening of sung contemplative prayer. It is a simple, meditative form of worship, calling us to dwell deeply on Christ's presence around and within us. Chanted songs (like "Jesus, Remember Me"), prayerful silence, and short readings guide the focus of the prayer in a candle-lit environment. This evening of **Taizé Prayer will approximately one hour from 7:30 pm to 8:30 pm** and will be followed by a time of fellowship in the

vestibule. This Taizé Prayer is sponsored by the Justice and Peace Commission of the Catholic Archdiocese of Kingston and the Anglican Diocese of Ontario and will feature a talk on Peace given by His Grace, Archbishop Mulhall.

Taizé Prayer is named for the ecumenical Christian community formed in the town of Taizé, France during World War II. Today the Taizé community includes brothers from all Christian denominations, including Catholic, Orthodox and Protestant traditions. Please join for this most peace filled evening on Peace.

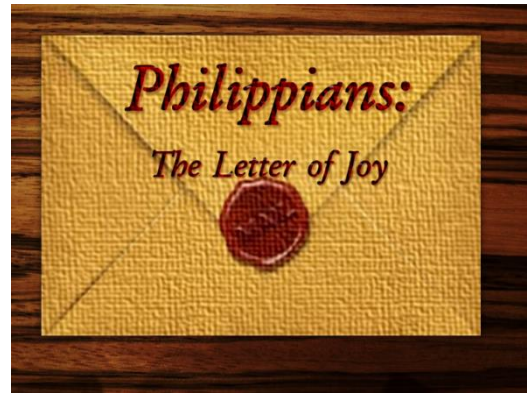
Life Chain: Sunday October 6th, 2024

This peaceful and silent demonstration brings awareness to the ongoing injustice of abortion and the harm it inflicts on mothers, fathers, and the community at large. It is a simple but powerful reminder to our fellow citizens of our duty to defend the weakest members of our society. St. Joseph's Parish will be hosting this year's Kingston Life Chain after the 11am Sunday Mass. We will gather at the southwest corner of the church for a prayer. Pro-life signs will be available. We will proceed to the edge of St. Joseph's parking lot facing Sir John A MacDonald Blvd led by our Canadian Flag, followed by St. Joseph's CWL and K of C banners. We will provide silent prayer and witness for one hour.
