St. Mary's Cathedral 200th Anniversary Redecoration Project

THE *PIETÀ* SHRINE

St Mary's *Pietà* statue was donated by the Hickey family in 1891 AD. *Pietà* has its roots in the Italian word for "Pity" or "Compassion". The sculpture captures the moment when the body of our crucified Lord was taken down from the cross and cradled in the arms of His grieving Mother Mary. The *Pietà* is one of the most recognizable and enduring Christian symbols in history. It is a sorrowful scene, but one that also holds the promise of hope and redemption. Mary's gaze is downcast, but she has not been defeated by the death of her son. There is strength and serenity within her which she now offers to us. In depictions of the *Pietà*, we see the depth of Mary's surrender — and we are encouraged to emulate her example.

The *Pietà* statue at St Mary's will be moved from the vestibule to the Left of the Sanctuary from the perspective of the people, where the present tabernacle is located. Pictured on the right is the model for the new *Pietà* shrine.

Interesting fact: Carlos Nunes, the designer of our renovation project, is the artist who repainted the *Pietà*, sometime in the 1990's.

The Art of Living: Cultivating The Virtues

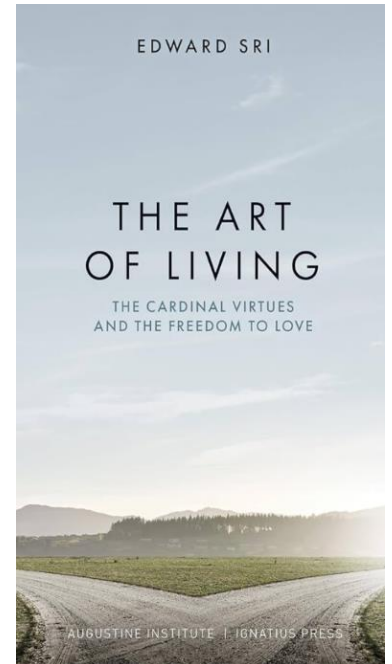

Looking Ahead

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5th. Easter Sunday is April 20th. Easter is almost as late as it possibly can be. Remember the date of Easter is calculated by the lunar calendar. The date of Easter is the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring Equinox. The full moon in March will be the 14th. The Spring Equinox is March 21st. So, the first full moon after the Spring Equinox is the April full moon which is April 13th. The next Sunday is April 20th which is therefore Easter Sunday.
