Thank you to all who expressed an opinion about the Painting of the Stations of the Cross.

Domenic Sanfilippo and Angela Gambin counted the ballots. The majority voted YES we should return the Stations to the colour which they originally were. Father John Hibbard was here and he indicated that when the last renovation was done in 1981 that the dark brown painting was put on the Stations of the Cross at that time. He was an assistant priest here at that time and when he arrived some of the Stations were off the walls for the 1981 renovation.



I will just list a few of the Yes and No comments for you to ponder.

Those who voted no said:

- a) Many who voted No said that they wanted to go with tradition. However, unbeknownst to them, the tradition is that the Stations were in colour and the bronze and dark brown were a recent addition.
- b) Many who voted No thought the colour did not go with the wall colour. As you know from the presentation and the Flocknote and bulletin, the colour of the walls will be much lighter than the yellow they are now.
- c) Some felt the gold was better with the present lighting. The present lighting will be modernized and adapted to the beauty of the windows and any colour that is added the Cathedral.
- d) Some felt that the colour would detract from the beauty of the stained glass windows.
- e) Some felt colour might be distracting.

Those who voted yes said:

- a) It is easier to see each of the characters. One person said they didn't even really see Pontius Pilate until they saw the painted rendition.
- b) Many said they felt part of the Stations and therefore could relate to the people in them. That the gold left them cold and statue-like and the colour made the characters, especially Our Lord, like real people that actually existed.
- c) the colour makes them stand out.
- d) Some said that restoring the Stations to their original colours was ideal.
- e) Some said the cathedral just needs more colour.
- f) The colour looks nice and compliments the windows nicely.

All good points on both sides worthy of pondering.
