

ST MARY'S PILGRIMAGE TO CAMINO DE SANTIAGO OCTOBER 2027

St Mary's is forming a group to walk the **Camino de Santiago**, the ancient Catholic pilgrimage route, beginning at St. Jean Pied de Port, France, south across Spain and ending at the tomb of St. James the Apostle in Santiago de Compostela. For over a thousand years, Christians have walked the Camino as a journey of prayer, penance, and a renewal of faith. We are planning a 35-day journey from approximately September 28 to November 3, 2027, culminating with arrival in Santiago on All Saints' Day.

Parish training walks will be held to prepare us spiritually and physically, and **all are welcome** - whether you hope to join the 2027 pilgrimage or simply hope to walk the Camino in future or just want to join in with us.
